This year for our 1st Sunday collection, we are focusing on lighting and art restoration, specifically repairs to the Gospel Saints around the rotunda. **With January and February's generous donations, we are already 10% toward our \$150,000 goal!!** In December 2021, the canvas of Saint Luke fell from the pendentive and now Saint John's canvas is visibly bubbling. To reach the base of the rotunda, massive, expensive scaffolding has to be hired as well a skilled labor. We appreciate all donations to repair our beautiful place of worship.

Pilgrims of Hope: We Turn to God and find Mercy

As we make our way towards the first Week of Lent, our faith formation families begin to reflect on the GIFT of forgiveness and our call to turn to God and find his loving Mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. There is a song by John Foley called "Turn to Me" which speaks of God's calling us back to himself. The refrain goes:

*"Turn to me, O man and be saved,
says the Lord for I am God.
There is no other, none beside me.
I call your name."*

This turning back to God is the story of humankind. It's a story of **conversion**, a turning away from something and a turning toward something else. In our Christian context, it means turning away from whatever is keeping you from God and turning toward Jesus in the Sacraments and finding our feet set on a new path, following the footsteps of Christ. In the photo we have a portrait of the Prodigal Son. In Luke, chapter 15, Jesus tells the story of a son who left his family to live a life on his terms—not God's—and found himself lost, alone, and poor (not just materially, but spiritually!). He returns to his father realizing how much he is in need of help, which brings him to also realize how much he has hurt his relationships with his family. It is a great sign of conversion, coming to his senses, he returns to the Father. As we begin Lent, let us too, 'Turn to God' and find salvation in His Mercy.



A medida que nos acercamos a la primera semana de Cuaresma, nuestras familias de formación en la fe comienzan a reflexionar sobre el DON del perdón y nuestra llamada a volvernos a Dios y encontrar su amorosa Misericordia en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Hay una canción de John Foley llamada «Turn to Me» (Vuélvete a mí) que habla de la llamada de Dios para que volvamos a Él. El estribillo dice:
**«Vuélvete a mí, oh hombre, y sálvate,
dice el Señor, porque yo soy Dios.
No hay otro, ninguno fuera de mí.
Te llamo por tu nombre».**

Esta vuelta a Dios es la historia de la humanidad. Es una historia de **conversión**, un alejamiento de algo y un giro hacia otra cosa. En nuestro contexto cristiano, significa alejarse de lo que nos aleja de Dios y volverse hacia Jesús en los Sacramentos y encontrar nuestros pies en un nuevo camino, siguiendo las huellas de Cristo. En la foto tenemos un retrato del Hijo Pródigo. En Lucas, capítulo 15, Jesús cuenta la historia de un hijo que dejó a su familia para vivir una vida a su manera -no a la de Dios- y se encontró perdido, solo y pobre (no sólo materialmente, sino espiritualmente!). Vuelve a su padre dándose cuenta de lo mucho que necesita ayuda, lo que le lleva a darse cuenta también de lo mucho que ha dañado sus relaciones con su familia. Es un gran signo de conversión, vuelve en sí, vuelve al Padre. Al comenzar la Cuaresma, «Volvámonos a Dios» y encontremos la salvación en su Misericordia.

Prepare:

1st Sunday of Lent

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Focus of the Gospel:

Next Sunday we take our first step in our Lenten journey. We hear how Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert, where he fasted and prayed for 40 days before confronting temptation by the devil. There are three temptations highlighted in Luke's Gospel: 1) over bodily desires/needs; 2) over humility and trust in God's faithfulness; and 3) over desire for earthly power and recognition. It is important as we start our Lenten journey of fasting and praying that we note Jesus was tempted toward the end of his time in the desert. 40 days is a long time to go without. He was obviously weakened physically. This is the first step—denial of the body—to grow in spiritual strength to overcome temptation. Look at how Jesus overcomes the temptations: He quotes God's word. He remains faithful to God's promises. He puts God's will above his personal desires.

As we begin our Lenten journey, let us not be afraid to feel the affects of fasting accompanied by our prayer; Jesus shows us that these are essential to conquer temptation and sin, and grow in humility and profound trust in God's plan for our lives.

Alone or with your Family / Friends

- ♦ The first temptation symbolizes the critical step of every spiritual journey: the resistance of the bodily appetites. What are you "giving up" this lent that can be a stumbling block in advancing in your spiritual life?
- ♦ Jesus used Scripture to bring God into the center. What commitment are you making this Lent to let God's Word lead you?
- ♦ Pray Psalm 91:1-15. Ask God to 'be with you' as you begin your Lenten journey.

Preparar:

I Domingo de Cuaresma

Deuteronomio 26:4-10

Enfoque del evangelio:

El próximo domingo daremos el primer paso en nuestro camino cuaresmal. Escucharemos cómo Jesús fue llevado por el Espíritu al desierto, donde ayunó y oró durante 40 días antes de enfrentarse a la tentación del diablo. En el Evangelio de Lucas se destacan tres tentaciones: 1) sobre los deseos/necesidades corporales; 2) sobre la humildad y la confianza en la fidelidad de Dios; y 3) sobre el deseo de poder y reconocimiento terrenales. Es importante que al comenzar nuestro camino cuaresmal de ayuno y oración nos demos cuenta de que Jesús fue tentado hacia el final de su estancia en el desierto. 40 días es mucho tiempo para estar sin ayunar. Obviamente estaba debilitado físicamente. Este es el primer paso -la negación del cuerpo- para crecer en fuerza espiritual y vencer la tentación. Mira como Jesús vence las tentaciones: Cita la palabra de Dios. Permanece fiel a las promesas de Dios. Pone la voluntad de Dios por encima de sus deseos personales. Al comenzar nuestro camino cuaresmal, no tengamos miedo de sentir los efectos del ayuno acompañado de nuestra oración; Jesús nos muestra que éstos son esenciales para vencer la tentación y el pecado, y crecer en humildad y profunda confianza en el plan de Dios para nuestras vidas.

Solo o con su familia o amigos

- ♦ La primera tentación simboliza el paso crítico de todo camino espiritual: la resistencia de los apetitos corporales. ¿A qué estás «renunciando» esta Cuaresma que puede ser un obstáculo para avanzar en tu vida espiritual?
- ♦ Jesús utilizó la Escritura para poner a Dios en el centro. ¿Qué compromiso asumes esta Cuaresma para dejarte guiar por la Palabra de Dios?
- ♦ Reza el Salmo 91:1-15. Pídele a Dios que «esté contigo» al comenzar tu camino cuaresmal.

En aquel tiempo, Jesús propuso a sus discípulos este ejemplo: “¿Puede acaso un ciego guiar a otro ciego? ¿No caerán los dos en un hoyo? El discípulo no es superior a su maestro; pero cuando termine su aprendizaje, será como su maestro.

¿Por qué ves la paja en el ojo de tu hermano y no la viga que llevas en el tuyo? ¿Cómo te atreves a decirle a tu hermano: ‘Déjame quitarte la paja que llevas en el ojo’, si no adviertes la viga que llevas en tu ojo? ¡Hipócrita! Saca primero la viga que llevas en tu ojo y entonces podrás ver, para sacar la paja del ojo de tu hermano.

No hay árbol bueno que produzca frutos malos, ni árbol malo que produzca frutos buenos. Cada árbol se conoce por sus frutos. No se recogen higos de las zarzas, ni se cortan uvas de los espinos. El hombre bueno dice cosas buenas, porque el bien está en su corazón, y el hombre malo dice cosas malas, porque el mal está en su corazón, pues la boca habla de lo que está lleno el corazón”.
