Pilgrims of Hope: We Turn to Jesus, the Son of the Father

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Christ's whole earthly life—his words and deeds, his silences and sufferings, indeed his manner of being and speaking—is *Revelation* of the Father. Jesus can say: 'Whoever has seen me has seen the Father,' and the Father can say: "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" Because our Lord became man in order to do his Father's will, even the least

characteristics of his mysteries manifest 'God's love ... among us.' (CCC#516). Christ's whole life is a mystery of redemption that comes to us through the blood of His cross, but this mystery is at work throughout Christ's entire life:

- already in his incarnation through which by becoming poor he enriches us with his poverty;
- In his hidden life which by his submission atones for our disobedience;
- In the word which purifies its hearers;
- In his healings and exorcisms by which 'he took our infirmities and bore our diseases; and in his Resurrection by which he justifies us."

Christ's whole life is a mystery. When Jesus became incarnate and was made man, he procured for us a 'short-cut' to salvation, so that what we had lost in sin (like Adam), we might recover in Christ Jesus, God with Us.



El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica afirma: «Toda la vida terrena de Cristo -sus palabras y sus obras, sus silencios y sus sufrimientos, incluso su modo de ser y de hablar- es Revelación del Padre. Jesús puede decir: 'Quien me ha visto a mí, ha visto al Padre', y el Padre puede decir: Porque Nuestro Señor se hizo hombre para cumplir la voluntad de su Padre, hasta las más mínimas características de

sus misterios manifiestan «el amor de Dios... entre nosotros». (CCC#516). Toda la vida de Cristo es un misterio de redención que nos llega a través de la sangre de su cruz, pero este misterio actúa a lo largo de toda la vida de Cristo:

- ya en su encarnación por la que haciéndose pobre nos enriquece con su pobreza;
- En su vida oculta, que con su sumisión expía nuestra desobediencia;
- En la palabra que

purifica a sus oyentes;

- En sus curaciones y exorcismos por los que «tomó nuestras enfermedades y cargó con nuestras dolencias; y en su Resurrección por la que nos justifica».

Toda la vida de Cristo es un misterio. Cuando Jesús se encarnó y se hizo hombre, nos procuró un «atajo» hacia la salvación, para que lo que habíamos perdido en el pecado (como Adán), lo recuperáramos en Cristo Jesús, Dios con nosotros.

Pray an Act of Love to God:

O my God, I love you above all things, with my whole heart and soul, because You are all-good and worthy of my love of you. I forgive all who have injured me, and I ask pardon of all whom I have injured. Amen.

Focus of the Gospel:

In our Gospel reading next Sunday, Jesus challenges us with difficult teaching telling us to "...love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." Is it possible? Young David—the great ancestor of Jesus—gives us a good example of how to love our enemies. King Saul was hunting him down for something he thought David did. But David, on his part didn't retaliate even though he could probably justify it. He had the chance to kill Saul in his sleep, but refused, saying, "...who can lay hands on the Lord's anointed and remain unpunished?" He honored Saul's kingship, and although his enemy, does not let his own feelings of being dishonored lead him to sin of murder. Perhaps Jesus was thinking of this very scene from the ancient scriptures when He taught on the subject. Perhaps Jesus was thinking to a future event, when from the Cross, he would look upon those who crucified Him with mercy and compassion saying, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34). Which way will we choose? In the face of those who hurt us, we can fight against our impulses to retaliate and choose mercy and compassion like Jesus.

With Your Family

- ♦ Read 1 Samuel 26:2-23. David was hunted down by Saul but chose the way of compassion and forgiveness. Recall a time when you were hurt by a friend. What was your response? Retaliation? or forgiveness?
- ♦ Have you hurt someone that you need to ask forgiveness?
- ♦ Pray Psalm 103:1-13. It lists ways that God shows His mercy. What are they?

Enfoque del evangelio:

En nuestra lectura del Evangelio del próximo domingo Jesús nos desafía con una enseñanza difícil diciéndonos «...amad a vuestros enemigos, haced el bien a los que os odian, bendecid a los que os maldicen, rezad por los que os maltratan». ¿Será posible? El joven David -el gran antepasado de Jesús- nos da un buen ejemplo de cómo amar a nuestros enemigos. El rey Saúl lo perseguía por algo que creía que había hecho David. Pero David, por su parte no tomó represalias aunque probablemente podría justificarlo. Tuvo la oportunidad de matar a Saúl mientras dormía, pero se negó diciendo: «...¿quién puede poner las manos sobre el ungido del Señor y quedar impune?». Honró la realeza de Saúl y, aunque era su enemigo, no dejó que sus propios sentimientos de ser deshonrado lo llevaran al pecado de asesinato. Quizás Jesús estaba pensando en esta misma escena de las antiguas escrituras cuando enseñó sobre el tema. Tal vez Jesús estaba pensando en un acontecimiento futuro, cuando desde la Cruz, miraría a los que lo crucificaron con misericordia y compasión diciendo: «Padre, perdónalos, porque no saben lo que hacen». (Lucas 23:34). ¿Qué camino elegiremos? Ante quienes nos hieren, podemos luchar contra nuestros impulsos de tomar represalias y elegir la misericordia y la compasión como Jesús.

READING 1 **JER 17:5-8**

Thus says the LORD:

Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the LORD. He is like a barren bush in the desert that enjoys no change of season, but stands in a lava waste, a salt and empty earth. Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose hope is the LORD. He is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream: it fears not the heat when it comes; its leaves stay green; in the year of drought it shows no distress, but still bears fruit.
