A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥158 (Matt 瑪11:28-30) Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

成聖並非那麼困難；不是有些人想像那樣，必須每天禁食並做各種補贖。

天主以簡單方式給予人聖潔生活指引；是什麼？耶穌說：“我父將一切交给了我；除了父外，沒有人認識子；除了子和子所願意啟示的人外，也沒有人認識父。”（瑪11:27）。換言之：“如果你想看看天主是什麼樣子，或居住天主心裡，看我！”耶穌也說：“因為我的軛是柔和的，我的擔子是輕鬆的。”向耶穌學習，他的軛和擔子是柔和以及輕鬆的，這就是成聖最簡單方法。

“軛” (yugo) 比作負擔或束縛，如奴隸一樣生活。“擔子” (phortion) 揭示耶穌要門徒所做的事。耶穌的軛和擔子都跟法利塞人的強迫他人遵守法律形成鮮明對比。

耶穌說他的“軛是柔和的”，意即無論誰負起愛德的軛，任何人事物都是容易的。此外，他輕鬆的擔子也指向愛；愛能使最重負擔變得輕鬆。然而，法利塞人誤解法律誤導他人，讓天主法律變得難以親近和無法遵循。比方，613條梅瑟法律以及數千口頭解釋，都在主宰人的宗教生活每個層面。耶穌邀請負擔沉重的人肩負他的愛軛，好讓人建立愛的關係。

通過跟隨耶穌，一個人會找到平安、安息和更新。如果沒有，非耶穌問題，而是人的態度出了問題；人習慣用許多其他東西來增加自己負擔：焦慮不安、流言蜚語、缺信望愛、不安全感、年老力衰，以及成千上萬其他事情。耶穌關心我們，因他了解我們每人；他說：“凡勞苦和負重擔的，你們都到我跟前來，我要使你們安息。”

Jubilee Year of Hope: Our Families are Missionaries of Love

Our January theme is on the Family and the Sacrament of Matrimony. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us: *“The Christian family is a communion of persons, a sign and image of the communion of the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit. In the procreation and education of children the family reflects the Father’s work of creation. It is called to partake of the prayer and sacrifice of Christ. Daily prayer and the reading of the Word of God strengthen it in charity. The Christian family has an evangelizing and missionary task.”*

This missionary journey of the family begins when a man and a woman chose to freely give themselves to one another by saying ‘yes’ to “accept children lovingly from God, and bring them up according to the law of Christ and His Church.” God gives special grace to help parents love each other and to live unselfishly as they work together to raise children. The family as a whole become witnesses of God’s love for all humanity. When others see our families being kind and patient with one another, and expressing God’s love in their life of prayer and the ordering of their homes, families live out their missionary call of making Christ known by their lives of holiness and love.

La oración cotidiana y la lectura de la Palabra de Dios la fortalecen en la caridad. La familia cristiana tiene una tarea evangelizadora y misionera”.*

Este camino misionero de la familia comienza cuando un hombre y una mujer eligen entregarse libremente el uno al otro diciendo «sí» a «acoger con amor a los hijos de Dios y educarlos según la ley de Cristo y de su Iglesia». Dios concede una gracia especial para ayudar a los padres a amarse mutuamente y a vivir

sin egoísmo mientras trabajan juntos en la crianza de los hijos. La familia en su conjunto se convierte en testigo del amor de Dios por toda la humanidad. Cuando los demás ven que nuestras familias son amables y pacientes entre sí, y expresan el amor de Dios en su vida de oración y en el orden de sus hogares, las familias viven su llamada misionera de dar a conocer a Cristo con sus vidas de santidad y amor.

3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

Focus of the Gospel:

In next Sunday's first reading, we receive insight to why the lectern (where we read the Sacred Scriptures during Mass) is in a prominent place for all to see and hear. When Ezra opened the scroll and all the people saw it, they rose from their places in reverence. We do this in the reading of the Gospel, acknowledging God's Word is before us. In the Gospel, Jesus is preaching in the Synagogue, and all were watching to hear what Jesus would say. When we listen to the Sunday readings, it is important that we look for patterns of words to get a sense of the central theme, but also they can help us see what God is saying to us on a personal level. The word 'Spirit' is mentioned 11 times in the Readings. This can give us a moment to pause and ask, "Lord, show me why the Spirit is mentioned so often? What are you trying to tell me today?" Or, perhaps some other word or phrase / theme captivated your attention. Take time with the readings, and ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in your life through His Holy Word. You will be surprised to find that the God's Word is alive and teaching you today.

With Your Family

- ♦ Read Luke 4:14-21. Imagine you are with the disciples at Synagogue listening to every word Jesus says. What is He saying to you?
- ♦ The second reading from 1 Corinthians tells us we are all baptized into one body in one Spirit. What are divisions in your life that need healing? Ask God to help you.
- ♦ How is God calling you to greater attention to His Holy Word? Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you.
- ♦ Pray Psalm 19:8-15 together.

Enfoque del evangelio:

En la primera lectura del próximo domingo, se nos explica por qué el atril (donde leemos las Sagradas Escrituras durante la Misa) está en un lugar destacado, donde todos pueden ver y oír. Cuando Esdras abrió el rollo y todo el pueblo lo vio, se levantaron de sus lugares en señal de reverencia. Lo mismo hacemos en la lectura del Evangelio, reconociendo que la Palabra de Dios está ante nosotros. En el Evangelio, Jesús está predicando en la Sinagoga, y todos estaban atentos para escuchar lo que Jesús diría. Cuando escuchamos las lecturas dominicales, es importante que busquemos patrones de palabras para hacernos una idea del tema central, pero también pueden ayudarnos a ver lo que Dios nos está diciendo a nivel personal. La palabra «Espíritu» se menciona 11 veces en las lecturas. Esto puede darnos un momento para hacer una pausa y preguntarnos: «Señor, muéstrame por qué se menciona el Espíritu tan a menudo». ¿Qué intentas decirme hoy? O, tal vez, alguna otra palabra o frase / tema cautivó tu atención. Tómate tu tiempo con las lecturas, y pide al Espíritu Santo que te guíe en tu vida a través de Su Santa Palabra. Te sorprenderá descubrir que la Palabra de Dios está viva y te enseña hoy.

Con tu familia

- ♦ Lee Lucas 4:14-21. Imagina que estás con los discípulos en la sinagoga escuchando cada palabra de Jesús. ¿Qué te está diciendo?
- ♦ La segunda lectura de 1 Corintios nos dice que todos hemos sido bautizados en un solo cuerpo en un solo Espíritu. ¿Qué divisiones hay en tu vida que necesitan ser sanadas? Pídele a Dios que te ayude.
- ♦ ¿Cómo te llama Dios a prestar más atención a su Santa Palabra? Pide al Espíritu Santo que te guíe.
- ♦ Oren juntos el Salmo 19:8-15.

READING 1 IS 62:1-5

For Zion's sake I will not be silent, for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her vindication shines forth like the dawn and her victory like a burning torch.

Nations shall behold your vindication, and all the kings your glory; you shall be called by a new name pronounced by the mouth of the LORD. You shall be a glorious crown in the hand of the LORD, a royal diadem held by your God. No more shall people call you "Forsaken," or your land "Desolate," but you shall be called "My Delight," and your land "Espoused." For the LORD delights in you and makes your land his spouse. As a young man marries a virgin, your Builder shall marry you; and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you.

Brothers and sisters:

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the

manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues.

But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

GOSPEL **JN 2:1-11**

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there.

Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it.

And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now."

Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

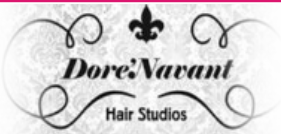
