



Stewardship Reflection

As our celebration of Christmas continues, today we observe the great feast of The Epiphany of the Lord. The word "epiphany" comes from Greek and means manifestation or appearance. The stewardship way of life is one in which we live in grateful response to God's countless manifestations in our

Our Gospel passage, from Matthew, has much to teach us about stewardship, through the actions of the magi.

As good stewards, the magi were watching for manifestations of God's presence in their lives. "We have seen the star at its rising," they say. Good stewards are keenly aware of the "star" of God's presence and His gifts in their lives. It is this awareness that fills them with gratitude and the desire to both worship God and share His gifts with others.

The magi, upon seeing the manifestation of God's presence in their lives, "were overjoyed." Good stewards, who live with the awareness of God's presence and gifts to them, simply can't help but be filled with joy. Not necessarily the fleeting and superficial kind of joy the world promises through wealth or power, but rather the deep, unalterable joy only God can give.

Finally, the magi were so filled with awe upon encountering the newborn Jesus, they prostrated themselves before him and "opened their treasures and offered him gifts." This is precisely why good stewards generously share their material gifts — as a loving act of worship to an extravagantly loving God.

Let us rejoice in God's manifestations in our lives and be watchful for the new ways He is calling us to share ourselves and our gifts in gratitude to our King in the year ahead.



EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION

While a day like Christmas is fixed in our minds and on the calendars on December 25th, many of the important feasts of the Church year move, based upon the date that Easter is set. Easter changes each year moving to the Sunday after the "Paschal Full Moon," and can fall between March 22 and April 25. In ancient times before calendars were common, most people did not know the dates for the upcoming Liturgical year. On Epiphany Sunday, the upcoming dates were "proclaimed" after the gospel in this way:

Know dear brethren, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior. On the twenty-second day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the ninth day of April, you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twenty-first day of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twenty-eighth day of June, the feast of Pentecost. On the fourth day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the third day of November, the First Sunday of Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.







The wise men wanted to find the great King and give Him their best gifts. They studied long and finally knew where He was. Then they had to travel a great distance to find the baby King. When they found Him they knelt before Him and gave Him their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, which were all costly treasures.

Last Sunday we looked at the event of the Visit of the Magi and their gifts to the Newborn King, Jesus at the Feast Day of Epiphany, which we Celebrate today. Looking ahead to next week—2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time—the Gospel once again turns to John the Baptist. This should make us sit up and take notice, and ask ourselves, "Why is John the Baptist mentioned so often during Advent and at the beginning of Ordinary Time?"

Read next Sunday's Gospel, John 1:29-34

- What do you imagine John is doing before pointing to Jesus and calling him "the Lamb of God"?
- Where / how have we discussed the Lamb this year in regard to Jesus?
- John tells his disciples to follow Jesus. Who do we point to? Can we also point the way for others to follow the Lamb of God—Jesus?



Agnus Dei = Lamb of God

We pray the Agnus Dei, or Lamb of God, during the Fraction Rite, when the priest breaks the host after the prayers of Consecration in which he calls upon the Holy Spirit to change the bread and wine at the Altar into the Body and Blood of Jesus.



Find the other **UNO the Sheep** for the Agnus Dei Prayer

At our Community Meetings in October we discussed the significance of the **Lamb** as a Symbol of Christ. We recalled how on the night before the Hebrews left Egypt, they were instructed to take an unblemished lamb and offer it as a sacrifice and take its blood and put it on the doorposts of their houses, so that the Angel of Death would "pass over" them. These instructions are carried out each Passover in Jewish homes to remind them how God liberated them from the bonds of slavery in Egypt. Jesus was celebrating the Passover with His disciples when He instituted the Holy Eucharist. Jesus took Bread and Wine and told us to take it. He told us, "This is My Body ... This is My Blood given for you." (Luke 22:19)

PRACTICE IT: Meditate on the words of the Agnus Dei prayer. How does it remind you of the mission of Jesus in the world? What are we asking Jesus to do for us in the prayer?

Gift of the Ten Commandments Don de los Diez Mandamientos

God always accompanies the gift of new life with rules for keeping that life. We see this in the Book of Genesis, when God gave Adam rules for life in the Garden of Eden. In the Book of Exodus, we read about how God led the Israelites out of slavery. He then gave them the Ten Commandments as rules for keeping their freedom. The Ten Commandments are rules for us too. They keep us from falling into a different kind of slavery: Slavery to sin. God gives us a gift in the Ten Commandments, because by following them we avoid stepping off the path of life that will lead us to Heaven. As always, God gives us all we will ever need to lead us closer to Him.

Chinese New Year Mass 2023 & Veneration Ceremony to Ancestors

A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 55

Jesus insisted that salvation had to go through the narrow gate and there is one condition: eternal salvation was the result of a struggle. The verb "strive" (agōnizesthe) means strenuous effort in athletic competition (see also 1 Cor 9:25; 1 Tim 6:12; 2 Tim 4:7). It is like the effort one would make in swimming against the current in a river. One must ever be going forward or else this one will go backward.

Jesus explains that salvation begins with faith. But it is also the result of how that faith is lived, as seen in the lives of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and the prophets. People can never "earn" the ticket to heaven by good works (this is the Pelagian heresy condemned by the Council of Carthage in A.D. 418), but must allow God to work in lives through God's grace, a grace that is reflected in our actions. Entering through the narrow gate denotes a steady obedience to Jesus, i.e. overcoming opposition and rejection.

What are the narrow gates in our life?

Human being is the image of God. One of the God's most gracious gifts is freedom. Thus, God allows people to decide what road they follow and what gate they enter. The "narrow gate" concerns about the relationship between God and humans. Entering the narrow gate involves being peacemakers or the persecuted, being salt and light consistently, and loving enemies. These are the narrow gates in daily life.

By going through, that is to say, by being a loving and lovable person, Christians will get the passport to heaven and be the eternal citizen of the city of God. With love, no one would have the power to bar the entrance.

救恩始于信德;正如耶稣列举古圣榜样:亚巴郎、依撒格、雅各伯及先知们的信仰生活见证。人们永远无法通过自己力量"赢得"通往天堂的护照(公元418年迦太基大公会议谴责的柏拉奇主义 [Pelagianism]),必须让天主恩宠活在生命;从窄门进入天国,表示走耶稣十字架苦路,准备遭遇迫害甚至殉道。

生活中的窄门是什么?

人是天主肖像,天主给人最大礼物之一,是自由。因此,天主容许人们自己决定走哪条路,进哪扇门。"窄门" 关注的是天人关系;进入窄门意味着随时准备成为受迫害者,如耶稣;还有成为地上盐世界光;最困难的一度 们,是爱仇。

通过爱来奉献生命,基督徒将获得通往天堂的护照,成为天主之城的永恒公民。有爱,没人有权阻挡天堂入口。
