Stewardship Reflection



Today's readings on this fourth Sunday of Easter offer us a glimpse into the heart of our loving Savior. He is the Good Shepherd and we can confidently

place our trust in Him as we live the stewardship way of life.

This endearing image of Jesus as our shepherd, and His personal love for each one of us, is described in our Gospel passage from John, through the words of Jesus Himself. Here we read Jesus' description of Himself as the "Good Shepherd." He says of Himself, "The sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice."

This aspect of our Lord's tender and personal love for each one of us is a compelling reason to embrace the stewardship way of life — in the offering of our time, talent, and treasure to Him, we can express our gratitude to Him for the incomprehensible love He has for us.

Embracing this way of life certainly requires trust on our part. But Christ has proven Himself worthy of our trust. He "bore our sins in His body." He calls Himself our shepherd and He offers Himself as the guardian of our souls. He has withheld nothing of Himself and His goodness from us. He would never ask anything of us that would bring us harm. He tells us "I came so that [you] might have life and have it more abundantly."

This Easter season, let us resolve to entrust ourselves and our lives gratefully to Him.

Liturgy and Music Corner Why do we sing a Hymn of Praise?

Some have asked me why we occasionally sing the Hymn of Praise and omit the Recessional Hymn. The short answer is "because the Church gives us this option."

For diocesan events, such as Ordinations and the Chrism Mass, we use the Hymn of Praise option 99% of the time. In my opinion, it's a glorious culmination of the Communion Rite where everyone stands and unites their voices in joyful song. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) instructs that, "When the distribution of Communion is over, if appropriate, the Priest and faithful pray quietly for some time. If desired, a Psalm or other canticle of praise or a hymn may also be sung by the whole congregation" (GIRM para. 88).

And here's something that might be news to you: the GIRM does not actually say that we are to sing a hymn at the end of Mass. The GIRM states this about the Concluding Rites.

"To the Concluding Rites belong the following:

- a. Brief announcements, should they be necessary;
- The Priest's Greeting and Blessing. . . b.
- The Dismissal of the people by the Deacon or the Priest... c.
- The kissing of the altar by the Priest and the Deacon, followed by d. a profound bow to the altar by the Priest, the Deacon, and the other ministers" (GIRM 90).

That's it! Nothing about a closing hymn. So, there you have it, in a nutshell, why we occasionally sing a Hymn of Praise. Next week, I'll bring up another liturgical option we use at the Cathedral that you may not experience at another parish: the Universal Prayers without a spoken/sung congregational response. 





Kids' Corner Esquina de niños The Good Shepherd




The readings in today's Mass talk about Jesus the Good Shepherd. In Jesus' time, and still in some parts of the world today, there would be flocks of sheep

grazing in the pastures. The shepherds were the men who looked after the flocks and made sure none of the sheep got lost or hurt or attacked by wild animals.

The Church is the flock of Jesus, and He is the Good Shepherd. He guides the people in the Church so that their souls will not be hungry- He gives us grace, just like a shepherd makes sure his sheep have lots of grass to eat!

Like the shepherd protects the sheep from danger, Our Lord also protects us from harm. In the "Our Father" we ask God to deliver us from evil. When our souls are hurt by sin, the Good Shepherd heals us with forgiveness in Confession.



Family Bible Moment

In our Gospel this Sunday Jesus gives us a big insight into who He is as He calls Himself the Good Shepherd, and He calls each of us by name. The shepherd guards and protects, just as Jesus takes care of us, especially spiritually. He knows us so well, and He calls to each of by name.

Looking ahead to next week—the 5th Sunday of Easter—Jesus continues to reveal a lot to us about who He is:

- I am the Way, the Truth and the Light
- I am in the Father and the Father is in Me

Read next Sunday's Gospel, John 14:1-12

- We hear in the Scriptures that our ways are not God's ways (Isaiah 55:8). We also know that God is constant, unchanging. If then, Jesus—who is God—is the Way, what does it tell us about our actions and ways? Are they in line with God's?
- We know that God—Jesus—is the Truth. This is why it is such a big offense to God when we lie, because we are choosing something that does not reflect God and His goodness. Look at ways you know you are not living in the Truth, and make a change.
- In a dark room, we naturally gravitate toward the light. Our world can seem dark; how can you bring light and hope where you are?

I am the Way the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥71 (Mark 谷 4:35-41) Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

If there is never a storm in our lives, it seems quite impossible to achieve true inner peace and we will not know who Jesus is. Why? Whenever we are trapped in dangers, or risks, or sicknesses, or simply see no hope in the future, we possibly ask God where God is and suspect whether God has forsaken us. Do we ever think of any possibility that God is trying to teach us some precious lessons through the important moments of life? Jesus always teaches us with examples in our life. Today, it is a storm!

When the storm was attacking the boat, Jesus was sleeping comfortably in the stern. The impossibility of such sleep in the midst of a storm indicates that it is there for a purpose. What is this purpose?

Unable to control their fears, the disciples woke Jesus up, accusing him of disregarding their safety. Jesus' response was immediate. First, he attended to the physical danger confronting them. Especially his words "Peace! Be still!" were a command, demonstrating Jesus' power over destructive forces. The verb "be still" (pephimōso) means becoming speechless or holding one's peace. Jesus' words resulted in an instantaneous calm falling over the sea. This miracle proved that Jesus was the Lord of the universe. He did change the great storm into the great calm. That is the whole point of the story: nothing could harm us while Jesus is with us.

Noteworthy is that the disciples were the insiders but they remained outside the mystery of Jesus as they asked, "Who then is this, that even wind and sea obey him?" What should we do in order to achieve this inner peace during the storms in our life? We might also ask the same question when we are confronted by storms of life, "Jesus, who are you?"

如果生活中從沒出現風浪,就不可能獲得真正內心平靜,也不認識耶穌是誰。為什麼?每當陷入危險、 風險、疾病或毫無前途時,會問: "天主,你在哪裡?"可能進一步懷疑天主是否離棄了我們。

其實,有否想過天主通過生命中重要時刻來給我們寶貴信德?耶穌總是用生活中的例子來教導我們,今 天,正是風浪。

當狂風巨浪襲擊小船時,耶穌正在船尾依枕而睡。狂風巨浪中,不可能有這樣的舒適睡眠,既然耶穌這 樣,表明他的睡覺是有目的;目的是什麼?

門徒無法控制自己恐懼,叫醒耶穌,並且抱怨他不顧他們安全: "師傅!我們要喪亡了,你不管嗎?" 耶穌的反應是立即的;首先,他注意到門徒生命遭遇危險,他立刻施行奇蹟,對風浪說: "不要作聲, 平靜了吧!"這是命令,證明耶穌的能力駕馭破壞力量。動詞"平靜"(pephimōso)意即變得沉默或保持 安定;耶穌的話使海面瞬間平靜下來,這奇蹟證明耶穌是宇宙的主。他確實把風浪頓時變為平靜;這是 奇蹟重點:只要耶穌與我們同在,沒有什麼邪惡勢力能夠傷害我們。

值得注意的,是門徒是耶穌身邊的人,可是仍然置身於耶穌的奧秘之外,他們問道: "這人到底是誰? 連風和海也聽從他!"


