

Reflections and Readings

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Stewardship Reflection



As we begin the beautiful and challenging season of Lent, our readings this week remind us why we need these 40 days so much. They also suggest a

particular strategy we Christian stewards might take as we make the journey toward Easter.

Our first reading takes us all the way back to Genesis, reminding us of our Creator and the loving care and lavish gifts He gave to our ancestors, Adam and Eve. He created them out of pure love and provided abundantly for them.

Life was good in the Garden! Until the first couple allowed just a sliver of doubt in the goodness of God to enter their minds.

Swayed by the words of the serpent, they became ungrateful and distrustful despite God's great love for them and all the gifts of creation He had provided. Sound familiar? These are the same temptations that threaten to pull us away from God today.

Our Gospel passage from Matthew shows us by the example of Jesus Himself one way that we can attain spiritual strength and grow to become more effective disciples and stewards. In this passage, we find our Lord in the desert, fasting for 40 days and 40 nights. Like Adam and Eve, He is confronted by the evil one. But unlike our fallen parents, our Lord triumphs definitively over the devil's lies and sends him slithering away.

How did He do it? By knowing the Scriptures and by proclaiming them confidently. And by His perfect trust in the Father.

This Lent, let us embrace this 40-day spiritual reset. Let us prioritize our use of time by committing to prayerful study of the Scriptures and trusting more deeply in the Father's love. We will surely be better stewards by Easter.

START OF LENT: In Russia, they call it Butter Week. In France they call it Mardi Gras or Fat Tuesday. In Venice's St. Mark's Plaza, they burn in effigy a straw figure called Carnevale that is stuffed with fireworks. In Ireland they call it Ash Eve and in England, Shrove or Pancake Tuesday. "Shrove" is an old word for "shrive" which means to have your sins forgiven by a priest in confession (you have been "shriven"). People would prepare for Lent by celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation and by asking forgiveness from one another. They would keep the disciplines of Lent (almsgiving, fasting, prayer) as their penance.


That was the serious side of Shrove Tuesday. Another was the eating up of Lent's forbidden foods. For over 1,000 years, Christians kept Lent by not eating animal products. The tradition was so important that in both East and West church communities observed this custom. Christians thought that by not eating animal products during Lent, they could better resemble Noah and his family aboard the ark (the first reading for the First Sunday of Lent). They thought they were preparing the world for a new creation. Whatever the reason, all meat, butter, eggs, and cheese got used up in a final feast before the Lenten fast.

Family Bible Moment

Last Sunday we reflected on this week's Gospel from Matthew 4:1-11, Jesus is driven into the desert by the Spirit to be tempted by the devil. Looking ahead to next week—2nd Sunday of Lent—we walk with Jesus in the desert as He allows himself to be tempted by the devil.

Read next Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 17:1-9

Jesus takes Peter, James and John up a mountain to pray:

- Jesus is transfigured before them, and Moses and Elijah are seen conversing with Him.
- Peter remarks how good it is to be on the mountain and wants to build booths for them.
- Coming down the mountain, Jesus charges them to not say anything about what they have seen until the Son of Man is raised from the dead.

How would we respond if we saw Jesus in His full glory? How would it change how we live our life? As we begin this Lenten Season, let us ask for the grace to be strengthened to seek Jesus through the Sacraments and know that He is God.

Jesus goes into the desert for 40 days, which is why we have 40 days of Lent. During this time Jesus fasts, so we too are invited to fast on certain days and from food that we may especially like. Our fasting and the experience of a little bit of hunger is so that we might hunger for God and become more merciful, especially towards the poor. In the midst of Jesus' fast, the devil tempts him with food knowing that he would be weak, but God's mercy allows Jesus to overcome temptation.

Let us Pray:

Discuss some or all of these questions as a family:

- In the past, what is something that has helped you not to give into your temptations?

Take Action as a Family:

 Have an evening when you do this Examen for families. We all give into our temptations at times, but Jesus is a merciful God ready to forgive our sins. Many parishes have penance services at this time. Pick one that you can go to together.

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥62 (Luke 路13:10-17)

Why do some people like to be hypocrites? It is because they see life as a speculative game, i.e. small investment for abundant returns; or even coming to a deception puzzle. Fame, money, and power naturally become important purposes of deception; however, "holiness" can also be deceived by those who are hypocrites. When people are tempted to go undercover with the devil and pretend to be holy in the church, they are deceiving everyone like boiling frogs in warm water. Finally, one by one follows them to hell.

When the synagogue ruler saw that on the Sabbath Jesus healed a crippled woman who had suffered from her illness for eighteen years, he challenged Jesus and said, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be healed, and not on the Sabbath day." The purpose of challenging Jesus was to exalt himself as Lord of the Sabbath; so the synagogue ruler was very displeased with Jesus with indignation.

The Greek meaning of the verb "indignant" (aganaktōn) means anger against injustice. Jesus was doing a good thing but they got angry with Jesus due to the fact that they see themselves as a holy one and Jesus is an offender to the Sabbath. Moreover, he underscored that he was the one whom God loved the most because he observed the Sabbath. Jesus denounced him directly and pointed out that they hypocrites untied oxen and asses to drink water on the Sabbath for the sake of their lives. Why did they challenge Jesus to heal people who had suffered for eighteen years on the Sabbath? They simply ignored humans' life and death but insisted to show off their love for vanity.

All Jesus' adversaries were put to shame. The present participle "opposed" (antikeimenoi) means resistance. The resistance to God itself is a shame. These adversaries were in sharp contrast to the people who rejoiced at the glorious things that Jesus had done. The two reactions come from two very different attitudes toward God. When people believe that Jesus is the Messiah, they are happy. Nevertheless, those who hate Jesus will resist Jesus as the Son of God and finally put Jesus to death. No matter how super hypocrites are, they deceive themselves in the end. They have stepped one foot in hell but hypnotize themselves that they are living in heaven.

為什麼有人喜歡當假善人?

因為看人生是一場投機遊戲,就是用一小點付出,就可以贏得大量回報,或甚至小小本錢都省回,就來一個欺騙迷局。

名利錢權,自然成為欺騙重要目的;而"神聖",也可以欺騙得來,這是假善人。

當人受到誘惑,做了魔鬼臥底,在教會內假裝聖人,然後欺騙眾人一起溫水煮蛙,一個一個跟著墮落地獄,法利塞人,就是 其中經典。

當會堂長看到耶穌在安息日治好已經傴僂十八年的婦女,不但沒有光榮天主,反之,藉此挑戰耶穌,說: "有六天應該工 作,你們在這些日子裡可來治病,但不可在安息日這一天。"他們這樣對待耶穌,目的就是高舉自己,讓自己成為安息日的 主;因此這位會堂長極不滿意耶穌的氣惱起來。

"氣惱"(aganaktōn)解作憤憤不平或憤怒,是面對不公不義的情緒反應,現在耶穌做的是好事,他們對耶穌竟然發起憤怒,因為他們看自己是聖人,耶穌卻是冒犯安息日的大罪人。與此同時強調自己守好安息日,是天主喜愛的人。

耶穌直斥其非,指正他們在安息日為了牲畜的生命,都解下牛驢去飲水,為什麼反過來挑戰耶穌在安息日治好痛苦十八年的人?這就是假善人,一切行為都是為了虛榮,罔顧他人生死。

敵對者因耶穌的反駁而慚愧, "敵對者" (antikeimenoi)意即反抗或抵擋,他們跟民眾成為強烈對比,民眾卻因看到耶穌治病奇蹟而欣喜,兩種反應來自兩個截然不同對主的內心狀態,心中相信耶穌是默西亞的,會高興;反之,仇恨耶穌的,當然 想盡一切辦法置耶穌於死地。

假善人無論如何高超,欺騙的最終是自己,雖然腳踏地獄,卻催眠自己活在天堂


