

## Readings and Observances

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### Stewardship Reflection



Today's readings challenge us to reflect on the true state of our hearts as it relates to stewardship. Do we think of stewardship as something we take care of once a year, simply a matter of ticking off

boxes on a commitment card — or do we choose to embrace it as a spirituality and way of life that allows us to grow in conformity to Christ every day?

Our first reading, from the book of Sirach, teaches that our good God has given us freedom to make this choice — "Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him."

The concept of stewardship helps us to live out the fundamental choice to put God first. Stewardship is not meant to be a mere external exercise that we participate in on an occasional basis. It is meant to be embraced as a way of life a life that involves a continuous conversion of heart.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus illustrates the difference between an external observance of the law and a true conversion of heart, saying, "You have heard that it was said... you shall not kill... But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment." Our Lord is asking us not only for exterior acts, but for a true change of heart. In stewardship terms, that means seeing everything as a gift from Him, to be used for His glory and the good of others.

In the week ahead, let us examine the state of our hearts to ask ourselves if we have chosen to allow stewardship to become a way of life for us. Only then we will experience its true depth and heart-changing possibilities. The choice is ours.

## Liturgy & Music Corner

#### Reflection on Desiderio Desideravi #15

Beginning with paragraph 42, Pope Francis begins to talk about the importance of symbols. In the Liturgy we encounter the Word, sacramentally. Instead of spiritual abstractions, material things of creation carry the mystery of God. Pope Francis list some of the symbols used in the Liturgy: bread, wine, oil, water, fragrances, fire, ashes, rock, fabrics, colors, body, words, sound, silences, gestures, space, movement, action, order, time, and light."

It is these symbols, used in the Liturgy that gives glory to God, not by adding anything to God (which is impossible), but because it allows us "to see God in the celebration of the mysteries, and in seeing Him to draw life from his Passover." Pope Francis then quotes St. Irenaeus, "The glory of God is man alive, and the life of man consists in seeing God: if the revelation of God through the creation already gives life to all living beings on earth, how much more then is the manifestation of the Father through the Word the cause of life for those who see God." Irenaeus Lugdunensis, *Adversus hareses IV,20,7* 

Quoting Romano Guardini, Pope Francis writes that the first task of liturgical formation is the understanding of symbols. It is the responsibility of us all, ordained ministers, and the faithful alike. He then makes this strong observation, (We have) "become illiterate, no longer able to read symbols". Every symbol is both "powerful and fragile". If we don't respect them, and treat them for what they are, they shatter and become insignificant. The power of symbols, of the desire of God to reach us in material ways is "always ready to re-emerge, as is every truth". Next time we will look at how Pope Francis proposes that we "once again become capable of symbols".

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## Kids' Corner Esquina de niños What does Jesus say about the Commandments?




In today's Gospel reading Jesus was talking about the laws of God. Some people thought that He would take away the old law that God had

given the Jews. But Jesus said that He didn't come to take away the law. He came to fulfill the law.

The old laws tell us the things that we shouldn't do, like worship false gods or kill people or steal. Jesus is telling us that just obeying the commandments isn't enough. He wants us to do everything out of love. If you really love a person then of course you won't kill them! But He says you shouldn't get angry at them either. You

wouldn't steal from someone you love- but wouldn't you want to be generous to them too?

Jesus says that the Ten Commandments are very important, but we have to do more than just obey them. We need to love!

## Family Bible Moment

Last Sunday we reflected on this week's Gospel from Matthew 5:17-37, Jesus gives us insight to His authority above the Law. Looking ahead to next week—7th Sunday of Ordinary Time—we continue the Jesus' sermon on the mount: Jesus challenges us to love our enemies.

#### Read next Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus challenges us in the Gospel:

- "...offer no resistance to one who is evil." In other words, do not fight with them. In fact, Jesus tells us to 'go the extra mile' when others press us to help them.
- "... love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

Jesus' challenges to love without measuring is a hallmark of Christian life. He shows us that we should have regard for all people, not just those who we get along with, or those who are agreeable to us. Loving of those who hate us is truly counter to all that the people of Jesus' day would consider reasonable. Who are the people that are difficult in your life? At school, at work, or even among your relatives? The perfection we are called to is to be this 'countercultural sign' of love.



Someone might say that if they know when the end of the world comes, they would prepare themselves by doing all kinds of good things in order to enter into heaven immediately. Yet, this is not a thorough preparation. Jesus does not prefer this kind of commercial deal but rather, a consistent conversion from sins, i.e. watchfulness.

In a reference to the story of Noah, Jesus ascertained that the sin of the people was placing too much emphasis on the cares and necessities of life. For instance, they were too concerned with eating and drinking – just as people are during the Christmas and New Year's holidays, or even birthdays. People just stuff their stomachs with food and drink but not giving thanks to God for life and mercy. Jesus reminds us that there is something more important than eating or drinking as he said in Matt 24:38-39.

Since God may show up without an appointment, we must be prepared at all times. This attitude of life requires our watchfulness and awareness. Jesus said, "Watch therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming."

Metaphorically, the verb "watch" (gregoreite) carries the meanings of giving strict attention to, be cautious; or taking heed lest through remissness and indolence some destructive calamity suddenly overtake one's life.

God will arrive unexpectedly. People do not know when a thief might break into their houses, so they are prepared for the thief at all times. Christians are sometimes so future-oriented that they forget the present entirely by spending too much time as to protect themselves against future uncertainties. However, what they need to do the best is to be more spiritually watchful to prepare for eternal life.

There is a saying about being saved by St. Thomas Aquinas: "Without God, I cannot. Without me, God will not." However, these statements could be reinterpreted in another way: "Without God, I will not. Without me, God cannot." That is to say, we will not be saved without God's grace as well as without our personal conversion; God cannot take us to heaven.

有人說,如果知道世界末日何時降臨,就會做好各種準備,好能立昇天堂。然而,這非徹底準備,只是商業投機,耶 穌不要天堂投資項目,而是不斷從罪惡當中悔改,即醒悟。

在提到諾厄的故事,耶穌說明罪惡是過分憂慮而忘記天主慈悲。比方,當時的人只顧"吃喝婚嫁,直到諾厄進入方舟 的那一天"; 就像人們在過聖誕和新年慶典,甚至生日派對,只是考量如何利用飲食塞滿肚子,而非感謝天主所賜生 命和慈悲。耶穌再次提醒信徒,正如瑪24:38-39所說,有些事情比吃喝更為重要。

由於天主不在預約情況之下出現,信徒必須時刻做好準備。這種生活態度需要醒悟。耶穌說: "你們要醒寤,因為你 們不知道: 在那一天你們的主人要來。"

動詞"醒悟"(grēgoreite)意即嚴密注意或謹慎守候;或是小心做人處事,以免因疏忽和懶惰而被突然災難毀滅生命。

天主不在人的計算占卜當中降臨。連小偷,都是在人們不覺察的時候闖入,因此人們需要時刻準備。有時候,連基督 徒因憂慮將來而花費超多時間來保護自己,以免遭遇不測,從而忘記當下。然而,需要處理最好事情,是醒悟,準備 永生。

聖多瑪斯有句名言: "沒有天主,我不能。沒有我,天主不會。"(Without God, I cannot. Without me, God will not) 這裡可以重新演繹: "沒有天主,我不會。沒有我,天主不能。"意思就是,如果沒有天主恩寵,我們不會悔改,當 我們拒絕悔改;天主不能帶我們進入天國。"


