Reflections and Readings

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Stewardship Reflection

Throughout our readings today, we see the amazing truth that the Holy Spirit gives us gifts and guidance in a very personal way. We are meant to use these gifts to build up the Body of Christ in a way that is unique to each one of us.

Our first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, recalls the dramatic moment when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the apostles. "Suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim."

Notice how personal and individual is this outpouring of the Spirit. This personalized way of "gifting" the apostles allowed them each to reach different people, sharing with them the "mighty acts of God." Embracing the stewardship way of life means that we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us in the best use of the unique gifts He has given to each of us, to accomplish the particular mission entrusted to us.

Jesus gives us this mission in our Gospel passage from John. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." But we must not let this responsibility overwhelm us. Jesus Himself, tells us so — "Peace be with you."

As this Easter season comes to a close, let us be at peace. And let us resolve to lean on the Holy Spirit more and more as our guide through the stewardship way of life.








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Pastor's Corner



s we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost today, we are reminded once more of the great vocation to which God has called each one of us. As the Holy Spirit fills us, the Church, we become co-workers in the great mission to spread the Gospel and work signs and wonders. We might believe that spreading the Gospel and working signs and wonders is for a select few, but it is the work of every baptized Christian. We may have been taught that all we are called to do is simply pursue our interests and wait for Jesus to return. But through the power of the Holy Spirit, each one of us is challenged to live out the gifts we've been given in order to share the Good News and reveal Christ's Kingdom. There is no other pursuit in life greater than this, and any other pursuit is a waste of time and life.

Pentecost is the birth of the Church, the birth of a new Humanity, in which we are impelled to do one thing, reveal Christ and His kingdom. The grace from the Spirit to work with Christ, raises us up to see the great dignity of the Human family. We are not enslaved in sin, we are not unworthy, we are not lost, we are not alone. We are co-workers with Christ and co-heirs to His kingdom. As members of the Body, filled with the Holy Spirit, we instinctively use our talents, time, and treasures for the only reality that matters, Christ and His kingdom. Liturgy and Music Corner

Sound Updates

The Cathedral has an acoustic with four seconds of reverberation. What does this mean? After a sound source stops emitting sound waves, it takes four seconds for the sound to die away. Due to this reverberation time and other properties of the Cathedral's acoustic, both instrumental and vocal music sound spectacular in our church. No church in the area has an acoustic as ideal for choral music and congregational singing as ours. Furthermore, even though our pipe organ is of modest size, the Cathedral's acoustic naturally amplifies the organ to sound twice its size. The soundscape of the Cathedral is an integral part of the worship experience.

Unfortunately, the spoken word does not like long reverberation times. If a sound system is not meticulously designed to account for the acoustic, sound waves will travel throughout the church without focus. This may cause reflections, and therefore, results in a lack of clarity of the spoken word.

The second part of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Word, must be heard clearly for scripture to take root in one's heart. Many have been frustrated with the lack of clarity of the spoken word, so we decided to explore sound system upgrades last year. We have known for years that the amplified sound in the Cathedral is not ideal, and as the sound system ages, it only gets worse. In fact, our sound system died last Christmas Eve. Thanks be to God we were already working with Skip's Music to upgrade our sound system, so they quickly provided us with the temporary speakers you currently hear and see.

Earlier this year, the Cathedral paid Skip's Music approximately \$25,000 to provide us with the "brains" of a new sound system. Those components, which include the mixing board, are currently being installed, and we should be able to send sound to our own speakers by mid-June. High on our priorities is to have the new sound system tuned to optimize the intelligibility of the spoken word. God-willing, we will be up and running with a revamped sound system before the Fall.

I will keep you updated on the progress of this project.





Bishop Weigand 60th Anniversary




May 25th marked 60 Years of Priestly Ordination of Bishop William Weigand!

PENTECOST



Today is the second biggest feast in the Church year! Pentecost is when the Holy Spirit came to the disciples and the Church was formed. The Apostles went out and began to preach the

who wrote the Old Testament part of the Bible. It was the Holy Spirit who brought baby Jesus to the world through Mary. Jesus told His followers the He would send the Holy

Spirit to them after He went up into Heaven.

We all need the Holy Spirit. We can't do anything by ourselves. The Holy Spirit gives us the strength we need to do good. Did you know that we wouldn't

even pray if the Holy Spirit didn't inspire us to?

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever! Amen.

Family Bible Moment

In our Gospel this Sunday—Pentecost and the last Sunday of Easter Season—we find ourselves with the Disciples hiding in the upper room, anxious and afraid. Jesus had been killed and they are not sure what comes next. Jesus comes to them bringing the gift of the Holy Spirit. Looking ahead to next week we will return to Ordinary Time, but extraordinarily, as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. We hear in the Gospel the famous verse portrayed at sporting events, John 3:16:

"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life."

Read next Sunday's Gospel, John 3:16-18

In the Gospel, Jesus is speaking with the Pharisee Nicodemus about himself and His relationship with the Father and the Holy Spirit. This Mystery of our faith is the Most Holy Trinity. When we speak of the Blessed Trinity, we are professing two beliefs: belief in the unity of God (that there is only one God) and belief in the Trinity of God (that there are three equal, distinct Divine Persons in God). When we say that there are three distinct Persons in God we mean that one Person is not the other Person, and yet all three are one God. The word Trinity does not appear in the Bible, but the Lord clearly speaks to us about this truth. One of the clearest examples is in Matthew 28:19 (last Sunday), when Jesus tells His disciples, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."





Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥75 (Mark 8:27-33)

Jesus asked two questions about his identity. The first question: "Who do people say that I am?" The second is "Who do you say that I am?" It is a journey from blindness to full sight, from misunderstanding to understanding. What did open the eyes of the disciples? It is the cross of Jesus. In other words, following Jesus is no way but the Stations of the Cross.

Peter, speaking for the other disciples, publicly declared: "You are the Christ." To say that Jesus was the anointed one of God, was to say that he was the Salvation of God, a God who is for humans! It is evident that Jesus was well pleased with Peter's answer and confirmed his insight as a special revelation from God. In order to give a more advanced formation for his disciples, Jesus explained to them that he was not a political messiah who would reestablish the Davidic kingdom after overthrowing the Roman Empire. Instead, he was the messiah who would redeem humankind by his suffering, death, and resurrection.

In fact, the disciples were still blinded by their ignorance of God's mission and their lack of faith. They still put on the lens of a political image of messiah and moreover, they just desired to avoid any suffering and death in their lives. When Peter heard from Jesus with respect to his being rejected and killed, he was not willing to follow Jesus that way. Who will like being rejected? The passive verb "rejected" (apodokimasthēnai) denotes a life of being disapproved and repudiated. Peter's mind was filled with political fantasy. Thus, he was unable to accept the fact that following Jesus was a way of carrying a cross. Jesus rebuked Peter and called him Satan because the so-called smooth way of him was actually the real rejection of Jesus' acceptance of God's mission. Ironically, the smooth way of humans is not smooth enough to enter God's kingdom.

What does Jesus mean to us? What difference does Jesus make in my life? Is the peace that we find in Jesus reflected in the way we live our lives and live our deaths?

耶穌向門徒問了兩個關於他身份的問題;第一個:"人們說我是誰?" 第二個是"你們說我是誰?"這是從 盲目到明晰,從誤解到理解的過程。什麼打開門徒眼睛?是耶穌的十字架:換言之,跟隨耶穌就是苦路一條。

伯多祿代表其他門徒公開宣告: "你是默西亞。"說耶穌是天主的受傅者,就是說明他是天主的救恩,是一位 為人操心的主。顯然,耶穌對伯多祿的回答很滿意,並證實他的洞察力來自天主的特別啟示。為了給門徒一個 更加高級的培育,耶穌向他們解釋,他不是推翻羅馬帝國重建達味王朝的政治默西亞,反之,是通過受難、死 亡和復活來救贖人類的默西亞。

事實上,門徒因對天主使命的無知,以及缺乏信德而蒙蔽心靈眼睛;仍然帶著政治默西亞的假相,只想通過耶 穌來逃避生活中的痛苦與死亡。當伯多祿從耶穌聽到他將被虛假宗教領導拒絕和殺害時,他真不願那樣跟隨耶 穌; 誰會喜歡被拒絕?

被動動詞"棄絕" (apodokimasthēnai) 表示不被認可和拒絕。伯多祿腦子裡充滿政治幻想,因此,他無法接 受跟隨耶穌就是背十字架的事實。耶穌斥責他是撒彈,因為他所謂跟隨耶穌等同一帆風順,其實是對耶穌接受 天主使命的真正棄絕。諷刺的,是人的所謂順風順水無能讓人進入天國。

耶穌為基督徒是什麼? 耶穌進入我們生命之後有什麼轉化? 我們心中的耶穌平安, 能活出永生, 或活出死亡?



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
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
