Reflections and Readings

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Stewardship Reflection



Today we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. The Catechism of the Catholic *Church* tells us that the Holy Trinity is the "central mystery of the Christian faith" (261). The concept of the Triune God - Three

Persons in one God - is truly a mystery, almost too lofty for us ordinary people to even begin to grasp. Can the truth of the Holy Trinity teach us anything as everyday Christian stewards? Actually, yes!

St. John Paul II described the Holy Trinity as a "Divine Family," a community of Persons Who give themselves completely to each other and Who wishes to share Itself, Its life, with us. These concepts are at the very heart of the stewardship way of life. As stewards, we too, are called to share ourselves and our lives with others.

Our Gospel passage from John reminds us that the stewardship way of life is nothing more and nothing less than the imitation of our Most Holy Trinity. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes might not perish but might have eternal life." He gave Himself, in the person of His Son, for the love of us. We must love this God back now by giving ourselves, our lives, to Him.

Amazingly, the more we give of ourselves to God in love, the more we will find the "grace of the Lord, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit within us." The God of the universe – this mysterious, Triune God - invites us to an everdeepening intimacy with Him when we make our lives a loving gift to Him and to others through the stewardship way of life.

Eucharistic Procession for the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

The Cathedral, in collaboration with St. Elizabeth's Parish, will celebrate a Mass followed by Eucharistic Procession on Saturday, June 10 at 5 pm, culminating with Benediction inside the Cathedral and fellowship in Mercy Hall.

When: Saturday, June 10 Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, "Corpus Christi" at 5 pm Where: St. Elizabeth's Parish, 1817 12th Street (located on the corner of 12th Street and S Street with ample off street parking. Procession to the Cathedral 1017 11th Street. Plan on taking light rail back.

What: Mass at St. Elizabeth's followed by Eucharistic Procession to the Cathedral, culminating with Benediction inside the Cathedral and fellowship in Mercy Hall

Why: In Eucharistic Procession, "the Christian people give public witness of faith and to their devotion toward this sacrament".

Father O'Reilly, pastor of both the Cathedral and St. Elizabeth, will be the presider.

In the past, we have done a procession loop where we end up in Capitol Park for a moment of adoration and then return to the Cathedral. With the participation of two churches this year, we follow the preference that Eucharistic Processions begin in one church and end in another (HCWEOM, 107).

On this Corpus Christi, we begin the parish phase of the **National Eucharistic Revival**. The US Bishops have created a comprehensive website for the Eucharistic Revival. To visit that website for more information, please see the graphic below.




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Today: Bishop Weigand 60th Anniversary

Kids' Corner Esquina de niños

The Holy Trinity Today we are celebrating the feast of the Holy Trinity.

Today we are celebrating the feast of the Holy Trinity. "Trinity" means "three" and tells us that there are three Persons in God. There is only one God, but God is a relationship of the Father and the Son (Jesus) and the Holy Spirit.

Each of the Persons in the Holy Trinity is really God, so the Father is really God, and Jesus is really God, and the Holy Spirit is really God. But they are not all the same Person. Each of the Persons in the Holy Trinity is also equal to all the others. So the Father is not greater than the Son or the Holy Spirit; they are all equal.

Sometimes we can undersand the Holy Trinity as if it were like a family. Each of the persons is different, but the family wouldn't really exist if any one of them were missing. The Holy Trinity is also a relationship of love. Because God is so full of love He wanted to share it with others, so that is why He made us! When we live the way God wants us to we are joining in the life of the Holy Trinity. Isn't that amazing?



Family Bible Moment

Our Gospel this Sunday—Trinity Sunday—takes an extraordinary return to Ordinary Time. We find ourselves in the Gospel sitting with Jesus and the Pharisee Nicodemus conversing about the God and Jesus' relationship between God the Son with God the Father and God the Spirit. We are challenged to be open this essential mystery to our faith—the Most Holy Trinity. Looking ahead to next week we will continue to be challenged with essential mysteries of our Faith with the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus, Corpus Christi. In the Gospel of John, chapter 6, Jesus tells us, "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day."

Read next Sunday's Gospel, John 6:51-58

All of our readings next Sunday focus on the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The first reading gives an account of the Institution narrative of the Eucharist, which will sound familiar, since we hear at every Mass how Jesus did four things: 1) took bread, 2) gave thanks, 3) broke the bread, and 4) gave it to His disciples. In the Gospel, Jesus stresses that He is our Life, and He alone will satisfy our hunger and thirst. Every Mass we are invited to come to the table and let Jesus be present to us both physically and spiritually. Do you notice his presence at Mass?

What makes the Family Faith Formation different from other programs?

Unlike other programs where children learn without their parents, the Cathedral believes in the power of having families learn their faith together. After an opening prayer, children go with Catechists to learn at their level while the same theme is discussed with parents, equipping parents to truly lead their children in their domestic Church (home).

1st Communion Track (3 steps)

- one full year of General Formation.
- Ist Reconciliation 2nd grade or older.
- Ist Communion 3rd grade or older and completed year of 1st Reconciliation.

Confirmation Track (3 steps)

- one full year of General Formation 6th grade / older.
- Confirmation 1 7th grade or older and completion of year of General Formation.
- Confirmation 2 8th grade or older <u>and</u> completion of year of General Formation and Confirmation 1.

How will my child be prepared for the Sacraments as part of Faith Formation?

What should we do in order to take up Jesus' cross and follow him as his loyal disciples?

To counter the opposition expressed by Peter and to emphasize the fact that he was not the political messiah, Jesus declared the stringent conditions to be met by his disciples. "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me."

There are two steps before following Jesus. The first step is "to deny" that is connected with another verb "take up." "Deny" (aparnēsasthō) here means that one has to forget oneself, lose sight of oneself and one's own interests. That is to say, anyone who follows Jesus has to completely entrust his/her life to Jesus and love Jesus until s/he integrates with the love of Jesus. The second step is to "take up" the cross. This verb "take" (aratō) denotes the commitment of life in the church by taking upon and carrying what has been raised, i.e. the testimony to God's love even unto death.

How do we integrate our crosses with that of Jesus? Carrying the cross always means pain and suffering. Our sufferings from witnessing to God become the cross of Jesus with its saving power only when we suffer by serving others with self-giving love. This means that as Jesus' followers we should live our lives and deaths according to what is demonstrated by Jesus, in particular his cross event.

Living our deaths here means we die with the hope of resurrection, especially when we are persecuted for Jesus. Before all these commitments, we ask ourselves three questions: Is Jesus a living experience for me, walking with me, loving me, forgiving me, helping me, and transforming my life? Are there areas where my life is not noticeably different from the lives of those who see Jesus as irrelevant? Is the peace, joy, and love that we find in Jesus reflected in the way we live our lives and also the way we live our deaths?

該怎樣做才能背起耶穌的十字架,並忠貞跟隨他?

為了反駁伯多祿貪生怕死的論調,耶穌強調他不是政治默西亞,並且告訴門徒必須滿全跟隨他的嚴格條件:"誰若願意跟隨我,該棄絕自己,背著自己的十字架,跟隨我。"

跟隨耶穌之前有兩步驟,第一步是"棄絕"以及下一步的"背著自己的十字架"。 "棄絕" (aparnēsasthō)意即忘記自己利益,也就是說,任何跟隨耶穌的人必須將自己生命完全交託給耶穌,愛 耶穌直到與他的愛共融為一。隨著第二步是"背起"(aratō)十字架;這動詞表示通過接受和承擔,見證 天主的愛直到致命。

如何將我們的十字架與耶穌的結合起來?背負十字架總是帶著痛苦和磨難,只有以自我交付的愛去服務 他人時,因見證天主的愛而受苦受難,才能結合耶穌的十字架。這行動意味著作為耶穌的門徒,該根據 耶穌所展示的來活,尤其是他的十字架事件來生活和死亡。

死亡是帶著復活的希望死去,當我們為耶穌而受迫害時

在做出所有這些承諾之前,自省三個問題: 1.耶穌對我來說是一個活生生的經歷、與我同行、愛護我、 寬恕我、幫助我以及轉化我的生活嗎? 在某些方面,我的生活與那些認為耶穌無關重要的人的生活有否 明顯差別? 在耶穌裡找到的平安、喜樂和大愛,是否反映在我們的生活方式和死亡方式中?
