STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

As we celebrate this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we can study His actions at the Jordan River as a powerful example of servant leadership. We see in Jesus a type of leadership that is characterized by humility and leading by example.

Certainly, the sinless Savior did not need a baptism of repentance! But Jesus humbly made Himself one with his people to draw us to Him and create a relationship with us so that we would be open to His teachings and influence. As servant leader, we also see that Jesus leads by example. He doesn't just tell the people they need to be baptized. He shows them how and does it Himself to teach them. To lead like Jesus, we, too, must "walk the walk" and not just "talk the talk." If we want those who we lead to be generous and hardworking, then we must show them how to do this by demonstrating generosity and hard work ourselves.

Immediately after His baptism, we learn of the powerful affirmation of the Father who opens the heavens, sends the Holy Spirit upon Jesus in bodily form, and says audibly, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well-pleased." Let us be filled with gratitude for our amazing God and be reminded that when we are grateful followers of Jesus and servant-leaders in imitation of Him, the Father will be well-pleased with us, too.








One of the great joys of being a priest is having many opportunities to celebrate the sacrament of Baptism. Not only does the sacrament bring families closer together, involving many members and friends, some of whom have been absent from church life for years, not only does the sacrament bring grace upon the one who is being baptized and upon all those who witness the sacrament, not only does it wash us clean and gives us new life and initiates us into a life in the church and with Jesus Christ, but it also provides an opportunity for me to appreciate the gift of spending time with the children and babies that are a central image of this sacrament. Children in the church and in the world can often be under-appreciated. Their voices may ring throughout the church during father's homily, but no real and significant decisions will be made in response to their cries. But in the sacrament of baptism, the babies and young children take center stage. Even when adults are baptized, their life starts fresh, and in essence, these neophytes are newly born infants. Baptism and babies go together.

Jesus himself was baptized as an adult. This great celebration of His baptism, however, is intimately connected with His birth and why it concludes the Christmas season and His being born into the world. Jesus certainly understood the significance and beauty of birth and new life. He reminds all His disciples that we need to accept the Kingdom of God like a little child. True discipleship is not about seeking to be the center of attention, but, like children, trusting that our Heavenly Father Himself will place us in the center. Babies do not put themselves in the center, other people do. As we get older, rather than trusting that we will be in the center of our Father's embrace, we seek to place ourselves, sometimes with great force, in the center and thus hinder His work.

As a priest, I sometimes find myself competing with babies and small children during mass. Yet, I remind myself that when a baby speaks, his or her words will always be more profound and Christ-centered than mine. If only I was as pure and holy as the day when I was only a few months old and baptized. I'm sure I was preaching some excellent homilies back then.

Happy Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and Merry Christmas!






Una de las grandes alegrías de ser sacerdote es tener muchas oportunidades para celebrar el sacramento del Bautismo. La Santa Cena no solo acerca a las familias, involucrando a muchos miembros y amigos, algunos de los cuales han estado ausentes de la vida de la iglesia durante años, no solo trae gracia a quien está siendo bautizado y a todos los que presencian la Santa Cena, no solo nos lava y nos da nueva vida y nos inicia en una vida en la iglesia y con Jesucristo, pero también me brinda la oportunidad de apreciar el don de pasar tiempo con los niños y los bebés que son una imagen central de este sacramento. Los niños en la iglesia y en el mundo a menudo pueden ser subestimados. Sus voces pueden sonar en toda la iglesia durante la homilía del padre, pero no se tomarán decisiones reales y significativas en respuesta a sus gritos. Pero en el sacramento del bautismo, los bebés y los niños pequeños toman el centro del escenario. Incluso cuando los adultos son bautizados, su vida comienza de nuevo, y en esencia, estos neófitos son bebés recién nacidos. El bautismo y los bebés van juntos.

Jesús mismo fue bautizado como adulto. Esta gran celebración de Su bautismo, sin embargo, está íntimamente conectada con Su nacimiento y por qué concluye la temporada navideña y Su nacimiento en el mundo. Jesús ciertamente entendió el significado y la belleza del nacimiento y la nueva vida. Él les recuerda a todos Sus discípulos que necesitamos aceptar el Reino de Dios como un niño pequeño. El verdadero discipulado no se trata de buscar ser el centro de atención, sino, como los niños, confiar en que nuestro Padre Celestial mismo nos colocará en el centro. Los bebés no se ponen en el centro, otras personas sí. A medida que envejecemos, en lugar de confiar en que estaremos en el centro del abrazo de nuestro Padre, buscamos colocarnos, a veces con gran fuerza, en el centro y así obstaculizar Su obra.

Como sacerdote, a veces me encuentro compitiendo con bebés y niños pequeños durante la misa. Sin embargo, me recuerdo a mí mismo que cuando un bebé habla, sus palabras siempre serán más profundas y centradas en Cristo que las mías. Si tan solo fuera tan puro y santo como el día en que tenía solo unos pocos meses de edad y estaba bautizado. Estoy seguro de que estaba predicando algunas homilías excelentes en ese entonces.





EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS- I Hope I Am Like Him

"Who is this Christ? Is he like you?" Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone

named Jesus Christ. "He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him."

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he

insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan?


