Stewardship Reflection

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. Our readings are focused on the gifts of the Word of God and the Eucharist. This feast has deep significance to those of us living the stewardship way of life

Why? As stewards, we recognize that all that we are and all that we have been given are gifts from God. We are called to treasure these gifts and use them for God's glory. Our Solemnity today and the readings for this week invite us to a deeper gratitude and better stewardship of the two sublime gifts of God's Word and the Eucharist.

In our first reading from Deuteronomy, Our Heavenly Father (such a good teacher) reminds us that just as we experience physical hunger from lack of food, we become spiritually malnourished through a lack of feeding on the Word of God. It is that important.

And, just as the Word of God is vital to our spiritual nourishment, so, too, is the nourishment of the Eucharist. Jesus could not make this any clearer to us: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you."

Without the Eucharist, we die spiritually. But through the Eucharist, we experience a taste of heaven right now —"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life."

As Christian stewards, we must recognize that in the gifts of the Word of God and the Eucharist, we have everything we need to sustain us in this world and guide us to heaven. Let us resolve to steward these precious gifts well with all our hearts, always.

Pastors Corner

This weekend is the celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Today also begins the Parish Phase of our three-year **Eucharistic Revival** in our country. Here at the Cathedral, we began this celebration with a Mass and Eucharistic Procession on the Vigil of this great Feast from St. Elizabeth parish to the Cathedral, with adoration and benediction. The Eucharistic procession itself is a significant way to highlight the presence of Christ in our world and on our streets. It also acts as a symbol of our lives and the Church as we walk with Jesus and strive to be His body in the world. In addition, the Eucharistic procession reveals to the world the reverence we show to the sacred species of bread and wine, now the Body and Blood of our Savior.

Of course, the Parish Year of the **Eucharistic Revival** will need to include many other elements if we hope to enliven the world through the great gifts of this Sacrament. Proper worship on Sunday is essential. The Church gathered together in praise of God, offering our lives, and bringing forth our sacrifices in works of charity and love, requires that all believers participate and offer heartfelt reverence. We all need to be well prepared and properly disposed to sincerely gather in worship, free of divisions, judgements, apathy, and preoccupations. The Church gathered on Sunday (in Mass) requires all of us to be in union with the Son to offer our lives to the Father. Properly celebrated, the Mass will "revive" not only the Church, but the whole world.

The Eucharist, however, also needs to be lived. The gift of the Body and Blood of our Lord always leads us beyond ourselves and into the greater world in which the light of Christ needs to shine. This light is meant to "enlighten" and not condemn. Care for the poor, the marginalized, and the lost will always be essential to a proper appreciation of the Eucharist. All our efforts directed towards better worship and greater adoration must lead to a revival for all God's people, in which He Himself said He is the Bread for the Life of the World.

Liturgy and Music Corner

Since we last talked about Desiderio Desideravi, the letter from Pope Francis, we have lived through Lent, Resurrection, Ascension, and Pentecost. What beautiful liturgies we have participated in. It's time to get back to what Pope Francis was telling us about the liturgy.

In the last installment, we ended with the question, "Who is it that celebrates?" We enter the letter at #51. Let's see what it says. #50 addresses ordained ministers as presiders, but here Pope Francis addresses all the baptized faithful, and the way they participate. "I think of all the gestures and words that belong to the assembly: gathering, careful walking in procession, being seated, standing, kneeling, singing, being in silence, acclamations, looking, listening. There are many ways in which the assembly, as one body, (Ne 8:1) participates in the celebration." He writes about how by doing the same gesture and speaking together in one voice "transmits to each individual the energy of the entire assembly." This is not in an

individualistic way, but in an "awareness of one body."

The gestures and words of the assembly are not a matter of what he calls "liturgical ettiquette", or ritualistic acts. "It is, rather, a "discipline," — in the way that Guardini referred to — which, if observed authentically forms us." Active participation in the liturgy forms us as Christians in conformity to Christ. Pope Francis goes on to write, "These are gestures and words that place order within our interior world making us live certain feelings, attitudes, behaviors. They are not the explanation of an ideal that we seek to let inspire us, but they are instead an action that engages the body in its entirety, that is to say, in its being a unity of body and soul."

Next week, we talk about silence.

The Body and Blood of Christ

Today we celebrate the feast day of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. At the Last Supper, Jesus knew that He was going to leave His friends. So He turned the bread into His Body and the wine into His Blood - even though they still looked like bread and wine - and told the Apostles to do the same.

Jesus gave the Apostles, who were the first priests, the power to change bread and wine into His Body and Blood in the Mass. Now at every Mass Jesus comes to us on the altar, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity!

Of course we can't see any change happen when the priest consecrates the bread and wine, but we know that God can do things without us understanding them. He loves us so much that He wants to come to us hidden in Holy Communion. Now it is up to us to love Him back with our whole hearts!

Family Bible Moment

Our readings this Sunday—Corpus Christi—help us reflect on the REAL PRESENCE of God in the Eucharist. The first reading gives an account of the Institution narrative of the Eucharist, which will sound familiar since we hear it at every Mass, Jesus did four things: 1) took bread, 2) gave thanks, 3) broke the bread, and 4) gave it to His disciples. In the Gospel, Jesus stresses that He is our Life, and He alone will satisfy our hunger and thirst. Every Mass we are invited to come to the table and let Jesus be present to us both physically and spiritually. Do you notice his presence at Mass?

Read next Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 9:36-10:8

Jesus tells how Jesus sent out His disciples to do works of healing among "the lost sheep of the house of Israel". They were to go out and to care for them with these instructions:

As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

You too are baptized in Christ as a disciple. How can you follow Jesus' instructions in your life this week?



A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥77 (Mark 9:2-13)

The primary purpose of Jesus' transfiguration is to allow him to consult his heavenly Father and ascertain his salvific work for his Son's suffering, death, and resurrection. The secondary aim is to make the three disciples aware of his divine glory so that they might discard their worldly ambitions and dreams of a political Messiah and consequently, might be strengthened in their time of trial.

While praying, Jesus was transfigured into a shining figure, meeting with Moses and Elijah. These representatives of the Law and the Prophets foreshadowed Jesus, who was the culmination of the Law and the Prophets. Both prophets were initially rejected by the people but vindicated by God at the end.

By Jesus' transfiguration, Christians are to be transformed from the sinful to the sinless, i.e. from the worldly life to the heavenly. How? Christians can follow the instruction of God the Father when he said, "This is my beloved Son; listen to him." What the verb "listen" (akouete) denotes here is that one should perceive Jesus' voice and further, obey him. This is not blind obedience but a commitment of life into the cross event of Jesus.

The first change after listening to Jesus begins at baptism, transforming us into children of God. The second transformation takes place by going through the trials of life with our courage integrated with Jesus' cross event. The third transformation arrives at death, from the earthly life to the eternal. In short, every challenge or every moment of suffering is an opportunity for transformation.

During our dark moments of despair and hopelessness, Jesus' transfiguration will help us to reach out to God. Through the acceptance of daily crosses we may become closer to Jesus especially in his suffering so that we may finally share the glory of his transfiguration.

耶穌顯聖容主要目的是讓他跟天父密談,確定他的救贖工程是苦難、死亡和復活。次要目的,是讓三個 門徒意識到他的神聖光榮,這樣就可放下他們的世俗野心和政治默西亞的錯覺,從而在信仰旅程當中獲 得力量。

祈禱時,耶穌變了容貌,光耀奪目,同時與梅瑟及厄里亞會面。這兩位法律和先知的代表預示耶穌是法 律和先知的滿全者。他們兩位最初都被人拒絕,但最終被天主平反。

通過耶穌顯露聖容,基督徒從罪惡生命轉化為無罪的,即從世俗生活轉化為天堂永生。如何?基督徒可 以聽從天父指引: "這是我的愛子; 你們要聽從他。"

"聽從"(akouete)這動詞意即人該聆聽耶穌聲音,進一步服從他:這非盲目服從,而是對耶穌十字架 事件的生命承諾。

聽了耶穌的話之後的第一個轉化點,始於洗禮,領受洗禮將我們轉化為天父子女。第二次轉化是通過我 們的勇氣結合耶穌的十字架事件來面對生命的高低起伏。最後是死亡這個終極轉化,從塵世到永生。簡 言之,人生每一挑戰或每一痛苦都可以成為轉化機會。

絕望黑暗時刻,耶穌顯露聖容將幫助基督徒靠近天主。通過每天接受生命裡面的十字架,基督徒不但不 會遠離,反而更加接近耶穌,尤其是在分享耶穌苦難死亡之後,基督徒最終分享他顯聖容的光榮。



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
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
