

Stewardship Reflection



Today's readings on this third Sunday of Lent present us with the theme of "thirst" and show us that a stewardship way of life can both satisfy our

spiritual thirst for Christ and help us to satisfy Christ's thirst for souls.

Our first reading, from the book of Exodus, begins with the words, "In their thirst for water, the people grumbled against Moses." What little faith and lack of trust they show after all God has done to free them from slavery. But Moses cried out to God for help, and sure enough, God provided generously to satisfy their thirst. He continues to provide generously for us these many centuries later.

Our Gospel passage from John recounts the lifechanging encounter Christ has with the Samaritan woman at the well beginning with His words to her, "Give me a drink." Then, He adds, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

Christ is speaking the very same words to us today. These two verses encapsulate the call to stewardship. Christ asks us to "give him a drink" by sharing what we have with Him and with others for His sake. Yet, it is Christ Himself who provides the water — the living water that is His grace.

God has chosen to include us in His plan for bringing all people to salvation through Him. We live out our part in His plan through a stewardship way of life. This Lent, let us resolve to respond to His call with passion and commitment. Let us do our part to quench His thirst.



Christian Initiation: The Scrutinies

Every year during Lent, we pray for the Elect as they continue their journey of faith towards the Easter Vigil. The Elect are those people who are looking forward to receiving the 3 Rites of Initiation - Baptism, Confirmation, & First Communion after spending a year or so in the Order of Catechumen. To assist them on their journey, on the third, fourth and fifth Sunday of Lent, the Church prays for them during the Scrutinies. What are the Scrutinies? That is what we will try to explain in the next few articles.

To begin with, it is good to remember that this period of Lent known as the period of Purification and Enlightenment in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is for the whole church. "The period of purification and enlightenment, which the rite of election begins, customarily coincides with Lent. In the liturgy and liturgical catechesis of Lent, the reminder of baptism already received or the preparation for its reception, as well as the theme of repentance, renew the entire community along with those being prepared to celebrate the paschal mystery, in which each of the elect will share through the sacraments of initiation. For both the elect and the local community, therefore, the Lenten season is a time for spiritual recollection in preparation for the celebration of the paschal mystery." #138 Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults Study Edition, 1988

If you wish to join us in praying for the Elect, the Scrutinies will be offered at the 8am Mass on Sundays. What the scrutinies are and the Gospel readings attached to them will be the topic for next week.



St. Patrick, the Apostle of Ireland, is called an apostle as he was the first missionary to the Irish people. Patrick was captured and enslaved for six years; he escaped, but felt called to go back to Ireland to proclaim Christ. St. Patrick is the patron of our diocese. The Feast of Saint Patrick is on Friday, March 17th. In the Diocese of Sacramento, the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to abstain from meat. If you choose the dispensation, you are obliged to perform another act of charity, piety, or penance.

Scrutiny the Elect

RCIA

Family Bible Moment

Last Sunday in our preparation for this Sunday, we met Jesus at Jacob's well as he spoke with the Samaritan Woman (the Gospel for today). Looking ahead to next week-4th Sunday of Lent-we witness an encounter between Jesus and a man blind from birth.

Read next Sunday's Gospel, John 9:1-41

Jesus and his disciples come across a blind man and the disciples ask Jesus what kind of sin caused the man's blindness. It was a common understanding in their time that bad fortune was punishment for sin.

- Jesus tells the disciples that his blindness was not due to sin, but that "...the works of God might be made visible through him".
- Jesus heals the blind man and gives him sight.
- The Jewish leaders question the formerly blind man, who is amazed at the leaders' inability to see the work of God through Jesus. What keeps you from seeing God's work?

Lord Jesus, take away the blindness in our lives, that we may see your goodness. Give us sight to see and desire the things of God always. Amen.



As our Lenten Journey continues, we attend to those preparing for Sacraments this coming Easter Vigil. At the 8 AM and 2PM Masses we will have special prayers, called Scrutinies over the Elect (unbaptized) as they deepen their prayer and longing for Christ. Let us Pray for them.

At the well she has a surprise meeting with Jesus. She slowly realizes that he is the savior, the messiah. He does not criticize or judge her for her sins, but instead mercifully invites her into a deep

relationship with him. She is so changed by this meeting with Jesus that she excitedly returns to town to invite others to "come and see" the man Read today's Gospel: who mercifully changed her life. During Lent, Jesus invites us to show the same kind of mercy to others.

Let us Pray:

Dear Jesus, You and the woman at the well both came to that place because you were simply thirsty. It was an unplanned meeting that changed her life forever. May we also look for your presence in unexpected places and with people we've never met before. Amen.

Reflect Together:

Discuss some or all of these questions as a family:

- When is a time you met someone who left you feeling really good afterwards? What did that person do to help you feel happy? How might you do that for someone else?
- What might you do to invite someone to "come and see" Jesus?

Take Action as a Family: Works of Mercy

- Comfort the sorrowful: Invite someone who is lonely to come to pray with you and to share a simple Lenten meal.
- Counsel the doubtful: Invite someone who doesn't usually go to church to go to Mass with your family. Maybe go to breakfast afterwards and share your reason for going to Mass.

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥64 (Luke 路13:31-35) Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

People, because of confusion or temptation, prefer to continue sinning and forsake God. Jesus is completely different. He would rather be crucified than to give up sinners. Why? If Jesus' love can be changed by sinners' offence, he is not the eternal God because love is eternal and unchanging.

The Pharisees warned Jesus, "Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you." Faced with life and death, Jesus did not look at himself but sinners. He calmly replied, "Go and tell that fox: Behold, I cast out demons and perform cures today and tomorrow, and the third day I finish my course." Jesus continued to minister to the suffering.

Jesus' love is like a hen's protection of her brood as he said, "How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you would not!"

The verb "gather" (episynaxai) means to bring together the children who are scattered all over the place, which means to be one in the kingdom of heaven, but this gathering has been rejected. Another Greek verb "would" (ēthelēsate) indicates hope, desire, or intention. The unwillingness of the people of Jerusalem is a complete disappointment in Jesus, i.e. eternal life. In other words, rejection is itself the death of true life.

Jesus enumerates their previous sins against God with concrete examples: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, killing the prophets and stoning those who are sent to you!" From ancient times to Jesus' time, they killed the prophets and Jesus. At the same time, they killed their own eternal life.

Jesus still loved sinners and gave them his final advice: "you will not see me until you say: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" As long as they repented, Jesus still fostered to sinners hope of eternal life, which is his death and resurrection. If both sin and repentance require courage, choose repentance.

法利塞人警告耶穌,說: "你離開這裡走吧!因為黑落德要殺你。"面對生死關頭,耶穌不看自己,只看罪人, 他回答: "你們去告訴這個狐狸吧!看,我今天明天驅魔治病,第三天就要完畢。"耶穌繼續服務痛苦的人。

耶穌的愛,如母雞對小雞的保護: "我多少次願意聚集你的子女,如母雞聚集自己的雛雞,在他翅翼下,可是你 們偏不願意。"

"聚集"(episynaxai)意即將分散各地的子女集合在一起,意思就是在天國內共融為一,可是被人拒絕。

動詞"願意"(ēthelēsate)解作希望、渴望或打算,耶路撒冷人民不願意,就是完全對耶穌失望,對永生失望, 正是真正生命的死亡,耶穌列舉他們從前具體抵抗天主的罪行: "你屢次殘殺先知,用石頭擊斃那些奉命到你這 裡來的人。"他們從古時到耶穌年代,殺害先知與耶穌,等同殺死自己的永生。

耶穌依然疼愛罪人,給他們最後忠告: "你們斷不能再看見我,直到你們說:因主名而來的,當受讚頌的時刻來 到。" 只要他們悔改,耶穌還是給罪人永生的希望,就是他的死亡復活。


