

# Readings/Mass Intentions

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# Stewardship Reflection

The Gospel Reading for today is what is popularly called the Sermon on the Mount. Many think it is the absolute epitome of Jesus' teachings. To be sure it tells us how we are to live our lives, the attitudes we are to have. We must remember that those who were waiting and hoping for the Messiah expected a military leader, one who would lead them in battle against their oppressors.

In His Sermon on the Mount Jesus gives a more accurate perspective of Who He is. He begins what we call the Beatitudes (the word means "blessings") with "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." In a sense we are all "poor in spirit." Without the guidance and strength provided us by the Lord there is no way we can escape this poverty of spirit, of spirituality, if you will.

That is why we often say that living God-centered lives is at the very core of stewardship. Being a disciple of Christ translates into being a steward of our many gifts and blessings. Some scholars believe that Jesus may have given this sermon often during His ministry. Those who followed Jesus and became the earliest Christians, the first members of the Church, were fond of quoting and referring to what the Lord said on this occasion. As stated, Jesus provides us with the secret of living a good life. If we rely on Him and follow Him, we will be blessed.

# Liturgy & Music Corner

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#### **PENTECOST**

#### Desiderio Desideravi Reflection #13

Pope Francis takes us back to the Church's beginning at Pentecost, to that initial community of men and women and writes, "Only the community of men and women — reconciled because pardoned, alive because He is alive, true because dwelt in by the Spirit of truth — can open the cramped space of spiritual individualism." This is what Pope Francis calls the "Church of Pentecost". It is in that community that now begins to celebrate the Eucharist within a liturgy that we can find an encounter with Christ (although it isn't the only one). He continues, "Only the Church of Pentecost can conceive of the human being as a person, open to a full relationship with God, with creation, and with one's brothers and sisters." This is the challenge before the Church today, this is something that Pope Francis senses in missing in the Church today. One of the primary ways for the Church of Pentecost to be realized in in the Sacred Liturgy. But, for this we must be formed.

Pope Francis quotes Romano Guardini who wrote that without liturgical formation "then ritual and textual reforms won't help much." (1) The topic of liturgical formation would take up too much space for this apostolic letter and so Pope Francis leaves us with only 2 things: "formation for the Liturgy and formation by the Liturgy." Formation by the Liturgy is essential and formation for the Liturgy is dependent upon it.

Next time we will see how Pope Francis elaborates on this formation.



# Family Bible Moment

Last Sunday reflected on this week's Gospel from Matthew 5:1-12, Jesus giving part of his famous sermon on the Mount and the Beatitudes, or the 'attitude' of a Christian (see Kid's Corner for the Gospel of today). Looking ahead to next week—5th Sunday of Ordinary Time—we continue the next part of Jesus' sermon on the mount: on salt and light—two signs of a follower of Jesus.

#### Read next Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 5:13-16

- Jesus continues his sermon on the mount
- Jesus tells us, "You are the salt of the earth..." We know that a little salt gives a lot of flavor to food. It is also a preservative for meat, and used to purify and clean. In Old Testament law, it was added to sacrifices at the Temple as a way of sanctifying the offering. How can you—as salt of the earth—preserve our world from corruption, from folly? How can you sanctify it, to make it a good sacrifice for God?
- Jesus warns that salt is good for nothing if it loses its flavor. This is the Christian that has lost sight of God's blessings (beatitudes) and their love for Jesus. There is no distinction that tells others they follow Jesus. How can you keep your love for Jesus alive that attracts others to Christ?



# Light = Something that makes vision possible

Jesus calls us—his disciples—'the light of the world'. On Easter Vigil, the celebration begins in darkness, and from the blessed Paschal Candle, light spreads to all gathered in the Cathedral, emanating a warm glow of Christ. Looking around our world we get a sense that it is walking in darkness. It is a temptation to simply keep our heads down, maybe embarrassed to share our faith, so we hide our light and do not let it shine for others to see the beauty of truth, in a life lived for Christ. Our call to be the 'light of the world' requires great courage, accompanied by a strong life of prayer. The simple definition of light—making vision possible—is what we do when we let the light of Christ shine in our daily living of our life, we make it possible for others to see beyond what the world offers; to be a sign of hope they may find in coming home to Jesus Christ and His Church.

PRACTICE IT: Jesus calls you the "Light of the World." Think of a situation in your life this week where you can let the light of your faith shine a little brighter. What spiritual gift can help you? Courage? Wisdom? Fortitude? Piety? Fear of the Lord? Understanding?




## Circle of Grace | Circulo de Gracia

#### Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 58

#### Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

What is this God to us? Is God a harsh judge like the master in the parable? Is God still merciful and kind if God takes away our belongings even we have not?

The parable talks about the faith of Christians that they should learn from the first and second slaves as to earn a profit. Noteworthy is that the third slave acted differently from the other two. He treated the sum of money as a fixed deposit entrusted to him and he guarded it carefully. He was honest to the money from the master; to be certain was that he did not take away the money for himself. Why did the master, thus, treat him harshly? That brings us to the heart of this parable.

Jesus said, "cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness; there people will weep and gnash their teeth." The adjective "worthless" (achreion) denotes that the slave was useless and good for nothing. He was condemned as worthless, metaphorically, because of his laziness and coward. This slave told his master: "so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground." What he was afraid was that he saw the master a person a hard man.

Love is not afraid of risk. In Jesus, the courage of love gives no room to fear before God. It is because we are supported by God's merciful love in every moment. Thus, we are not afraid to take risk and we do not just bury our talents under the ground and safeguard our own salvation.

What we do at the present will be our own judgment on the last day. Or better, we are our own judges. It is exactly what the example of the third slave means. What gifts we receive from God are for sharing with others in order to follow Jesus' as a fisher of people.

#### 天主對我們來說,是什麼?

天主是否如同耶穌所講比喻的主人一樣,是嚴厲判官?正如耶穌在故事裡面說: "凡是有的,還要給他,叫他富 裕;那沒有的,連他所有的,也要由他手中奪去。"天主還算慈悲?

比喻談論的,是基督徒的信仰,他們的信仰態度,要跟首兩位僕人學習。值得注意的,第三個僕人把主人給他的 錢,當成定期存款一樣小心保管。其實,這僕人並不壞,他誠實保管金錢;那麼,主人為何對他如此苛刻?這關鍵 道出比喻核心。

耶穌在比喻結論說: "至於這無用的僕人,你們把他丟在外面的黑暗中,在那裡必有哀號和切齒。"

形容詞"無用"(achreion)表示僕人一無是處,一文不值,這都由於他的懶惰和懦弱。僕人對主人說: "因為我 害怕,所以我去把你的塔冷通藏在地下;看!你的仍還給你。"他害怕的是來自主觀認為主人對僕人刻薄。

在愛內沒有害怕。當人活在在耶穌裡,愛的勇氣使人在世界面前無所畏懼,都是天主的愛所支持。因此,基督徒不 怕冒險福傳,不會將天主所賜才能埋在地下,來所謂保證自己的救贖。

每人每天的行為,將是末日的自我審判。這正是第三個僕人的結果。
