STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Throughout the Easter season, our readings have given us glimpses into the life of the newborn Church and the bold witness of the early disciples in spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ to all who would listen.

The disciples were the first to live a stewardship way of life, and their example is as relevant today as it was 2,000 years ago.

In the First Reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, we catch up with Paul and Barnabas in Antioch. While they certainly have some success in reaching many people there with the message of salvation, others are downright infuriated by their words and send them packing. Yet, we read that "the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit." Overall, it seems as if Paul and Barnabas had failed in Antioch. But seeing failure has not robbed them of their joy. What's more, they are filled to the brim with the abundant gifts of the Holy Spirit. How is this possible?

It is only possible because Paul and Barnabas saw themselves as nothing more and nothing less than stewards of Christ and His Good News. This realization brought them freedom — to offer themselves and their lives to others for the sake of the Gospel. The "results" of their efforts were up to God.

This Spirit-filled, joy-filled life is available to us all today. It can be achieved when we recognize, as did Paul and Barnabas, that all we have and all we are is a gift from God, meant to be shared with others for His glory. Of course, living as God's stewards does not guarantee a life of ease or a life free of sacrifice. Sometimes the steward's life involves challenges, requiring all the strength and love one has to give. In the end, there is simply no more satisfying way to live.

This is my tenth year celebrating the Easter season here at the Cathedral. When I look back over these ten years, it seems like a very short time ago. Of course, many things have happened during this time. In my personal life, I celebrated my 50th birthday, 25 years of priesthood, and the funeral masses for both my parents. In ministry, I have witnessed hundreds of weddings, quinceaneras, first communions, confirmations, confessions, baptisms and the simple celebrations of daily mass.

Many awe-inspiring moments have transpired in the last ten years, but recently during Mass, God reminded me once again that it is the tireless work of "volunteers" that brings to life the inspiration of Christ's presence. When I reflect upon all the members of this parish who have walked the path of discipleship, both along with me and long before I ever arrived, I am truly humbled. As a priest and pastor, it is surprisingly easy to forget the sacrifices people make whose vocation is something other than priesthood. I want us all to be actively working in God's vineyard. It's easy to forget that most of the work being done takes place in the domestic church, your homes. Having said that, hundreds of parishioners fulfill their vocation to married and single life while still being very active in the ministry of the Cathedral.

I could never name all the people who are fulfilling their obligations as stewards of God's gifts. Nor have I been as thoughtful to express my appreciation for all the hard work that has been accomplished through the generous hands of those who have been laboring here. I suppose I could simply accept the truth that God will see to it that each one will enjoy a heavenly treasure. But God has clearly placed upon me the command to express my gratitude for these last ten years in which so many of you have allowed me to work alongside of you and to assist in some small way a ministry of leadership. As we continue to embrace the values of stewardship, I pray that during the next ten years, I will gain greater insight into the ministry of appreciation, but for now, I offer a simple "thank you!"


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Este es mi décimo año celebrando la temporada de Pascua aquí en la Catedral. Cuando miro hacia atrás en estos diez años, parece que fue hace muy poco tiempo. Por supuesto, muchas cosas han sucedido durante este tiempo. En mi vida personal, celebré mi 50 cumpleaños, 25 años de sacerdocio y las misas fúnebres de mis padres. En el ministerio, he sido testigo de cientos de bodas, quinceañeras, primeras comuniones, confirmaciones, confesiones, bautizos y las celebraciones sencillas de la misa diaria.





A Glimpse of Spirituality (靈修一瞥) 21

Gossip can kill people; likewise, being arbitrary can also kill a lot, especially those good people who want to dedicate themselves to the church. In fact, this abnormal phenomenon has become a normal pattern, because even Jesus was arbitrarily killed.

Nicodemus, one of the righteous among the Pharisees, saw that the false religious leaders judged Jesus unreasonably. Thus, he courageously did justice for Jesus, saying, "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?"

Nicodemus proposed legal procedures, i.e. first listened to the accused and then checked whether it was true or not. Finally the accused would be convicted according to the law.

"Giving him a hearing" (akousē proton par'autou, it has heard first from him), which means listening first to what Jesus has said.

"Hearing" (akousē) includes understanding or reporting. It is not just hearing but a deep understanding of what Jesus had said before making an objective report.

Then "learning" (gnō) means knowing. It also denotes certainty or realization. That is to say, getting evidence after investigation so thus a person is objectively judged whether one is guilty or not.

Why did the false religious leaders not listen to Jesus' words, or investigate what Jesus did but immediately decided to kill him?

Everything Jesus said and did was for the glory of the Father, the revelation of eternal life, and the self-giving love of God. Falsehood is the opposite of truth. These religious leaders knew that what Jesus said or did was aimed at their own hypocrisy. If they listened to Jesus or investigated the case, they were doing self-accusation.

The evil power is not able to raise its head up before the truth. Thus, it destroys the truth as a strategy for survival. As a matter of fact, what evil power destroys is its own eternal life by killing Jesus.

其實,這不正常現象,已經變為正常模式,因為,連耶穌也被人胡亂武斷致死。

尼苛德摩,法利塞人當中一位正義者,看到虛假宗教領導無理判斷耶穌,替耶穌伸張正義,說:"如果不先聽取人的口供,和查明他所做的事,難道我們的法律就許定他的罪麼?"

尼苛德摩提出正常法律程序,先聽取口供,還有查證是否屬實,最後根據法律定罪。

"先聽取人的口供" (akousē proton par'autou, it has heard first from him), 意即先聽耶穌有什麼話要 說。

"聽取"(akousē)包含理解或報告的意思,所以不是聽听就算,而是深入了解耶穌所言內容,才做出客觀報告。

然後"查明"(gnō)意即知道,此外也有確定或意識的含義,就是經過調查,找出證據,客觀判斷是否有罪。

為什麼虛假宗教領導不聽取耶穌的話,又沒有調查耶穌所作的事情,立刻判斷要殺他?

耶穌所說所作,都是為光榮天父,以及啟示永生,還有天主子我交付的愛。虛假,就是相反真理,這些 宗教領導明知耶穌所言所作,都是衝著自己的虛偽行為,因此不聽也不查,就要滅口。

邪惡面對真理, 抬不起頭, 因此毀滅真理; 其實, 毀滅的, 是自己永生

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
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
