

Readings/Mass Intentions

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Stewardship Reflection

Today's readings are part pep talk and part marching orders for us Christian stewards. They offer wonderfully clear guidance on what matters most to God in the way we prioritize our lives and the way He intends for us to use the gifts He has given us.

The first reading, from the prophet Isaiah, gives us very straightforward instructions: "Thus says the Lord: Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own." The Lord gives no wiggle room here – care for our brothers and sisters in need is a "must do" for the Christian steward.

But note how generous our God is to us when we do these things. "Then your light shall break forth like the dawn and your wound shall quickly be healed." The more we give ourselves away the more we will find ourselves, and "light shall rise" for us in the form of more of God's grace in our lives and more joy and peace in our hearts.

Our Gospel passage, from Matthew sends us out on our stewardship way with a bang as Jesus declares to us, His disciples, that we are the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world." But, He adds, salt no longer gives flavor if allowed to go stale light cannot bring its blessed brightness if left hidden. Therefore, we must act! We must live our lives so that others will see the things that we do the ways that we serve others, care for the vulnerable, prioritize our family relationships and above all, our love for God – and then give Him glory.

This is the stewardship way of life. Let's give it our all!

Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

I recently decided to learn to cook. As I sit at the feet of various YouTube cooking masters, I notice how much of cooking is adding ingredients that don't provide any more nourishment, like herbs and other seasonings. But man! They make all the difference because they make the meal delightful to eat and share.

Jesus calls his disciples "salt of the world." No one eats just salt. So, Christians are not meant to replace or do away with the world. They are meant to be agents of preservation and glorification. Notice how often these days the Church seeks to preserve what is threatened: the goodness of marital and family love, the desires of young people for greatness, the value of honest work, healthy economics, and altruistic political engagement, the dignity of the poor and vulnerable. Over and over, we say to a world who wants to throw things out, "It's worth saving! We'll preserve it! We'll show you it's wonderful." If we can't engage the world like that, Jesus says we are the ones who get thrown out, because salt alone is worthless.


Jesus only asks us to do for others what he does for us. He is the "salt" of everything in our lives. Is there something in your life starting to rot a bit? Something tasting bland and boring? Let Jesus salt it and see if you like it better.

Liturgy & Music Corner

Reflection on Desiderio Desideravi #14



Pope Francis gives us a beautiful image when he writes, "Ordained ministers carry out a pastoral action of the first importance when they take the baptized faithful by the hand to lead them into the repeated experience of the Paschal Mystery." But, then he modifies this image by reminding us that it is the "Church, the Body of Christ, that is the celebrating subject and not just the priest." And that, "(t)he kind of knowledge that comes from study is just the first step to be able to enter into the mystery celebrated."

The next few paragraphs, concern the formation of priests in seminaries. Beginning with #40, Pope Francis begins to address "liturgical formation", meaning how we are being formed by participation in the liturgy.

Liturgy, in this sense, is not a mental exercise but a "real existential engagement" of the Person of Christ. It is not about knowledge, but "about praise, about rendering thanks for the Person of the Son whose power reaches our lives." The celebration of the liturgy is about our being "docile to the action of the Holy Spirit" who acts in the liturgy to help conform us to Christ. Quoting Leo the Great, "Our participation in the Body and Blood of Christ has no other end than to make us become that which we eat."



Family Bible Moment

Last Sunday we reflected on this week's Gospel from Matthew 5:13-16, Jesus continues his famous sermon on the Mount on Salt and Light—two images of a follower (disciple) of Jesus. (see Kid's Corner for the Gospel of today). Looking ahead to next week—6th Sunday of Ordinary Time—we continue the Jesus' sermon on the mount: Jesus gives a counter-cultural approach to the common sayings of His day and makes clear He is Supreme Authority.

Read next Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 5:17 - 37

- Jesus said, "I have not come to abolish the Law but to fulfill it." The supreme law of God is to do His divine will. The Ten Commandments are the foundation of all law. If we respect God's law, we then find it reasonable to respect (or Love) our parents, neighbor, friend and even our enemies.
- Jesus teaches with authority unseen before. He quotes the Law five times and then seemingly contradicts the Law. Only one who was above the Law–God–would do this. So in this teaching, Jesus tells us he is not just a teacher, but THE Teacher.
- Jesus teaches us the importance of reconciling with neighbor before asking God to forgive. When we approach reconciliation, are we truly sorry for the things we've done and seek to make it right?



We ask prayers for the 33 children who will make their 1st Confession on Wednesday, Feb. 8th. May the Lord grant them an openness of heart in approaching this beautiful Sacrament of God's love and forgiveness.





A Glimpse of Spirituality(靈修一瞥) 59

Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

Jesus indicated us how to be a real humble person. Real humble people are able to share what God gives but not to boast themselves for what they possess. Jesus said, "But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. You will be repaid at the resurrection of the just."

To the contrast, the Pharisees were preoccupied with "earning" a high place in heaven by their own efforts. Jesus counseled them to practice what they preached about God's concern for the poor and thereby to enter God's kingdom. The deeper message of this parable is that if we exalt ourselves, and try to earn the eternal life by our own efforts, we are going to face embarrassment before the seat of God.

Humility and openness to all are twins. This parable reminds us of not to overestimate our worth, nor to underestimate it either. The humility that Jesus exhorted us has nothing to do with self-deprecation because we are created in the image of God. Moreover, we are called to help build God's kingdom with God-given gifts. We are of value, not because of those gifts but we are loved by God as God's children.

By being humble, Jesus further invited us to associate with the grass root class of society since no more boundaries of rank exist since Jesus incarnated as a human. Thus, Christians are encouraged by the incarnated Jesus as to connect with the homeless, the handicapped, and the poor; physically and spiritually. St. Augustine said: "Humility makes people angels, and pride makes angels devils."

耶穌展示如何成為真正謙卑的人。真正謙卑的人,能夠與他人分享天主恩寵,但不會自誇。耶穌說: "你幾時設宴,要請 貧窮的、殘廢的、瘸腿的、瞎眼的人。如此,你有福了,因為他們沒有可報答你的;但在義人復活的時候,你必能得到賞 報。"

相比之下,法利塞人全神貫注於單靠自己努力 "贏得"天上高位。耶穌勸勉他們,要進入天國,就是關心有需要者。這個 比喻更深層的信息是,如果自我高舉,並試圖單靠自己努力獲得永生,最終在天主與世界面前蒙羞。

謙遜和開放自己是雙胞胎。比喻提醒我們不要高估自己價值,可是也不要低估它。耶穌勸告我們的謙卑與自卑無關,因為 人是天主肖像。此外,基督徒被召叫,就是善用天主恩寵來建立天國。人的高貴價值,不是因為本身才華,或名利錢權, 而是被天父深愛的孩子。

通過謙卑,耶穌進一步邀請信徒與社會的草根階層交往,因為自從耶穌降生成人以來,因耶穌的死亡復活,世界不再存在 等級,因為眾人都得救,無分高低。因此,謙卑的外展,就是接觸身體和精神上的露宿者、殘疾人和窮人。

聖奧思定說: "謙卑使人成為天使, 驕傲使天使變成魔鬼。"


