

Reflections and Readings

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Stewardship Reflection

Our readings for this second Sunday of Lent offer us, as Christian stewards, the motivation to continue our 40-day journey toward deeper holiness.

The first reading from the book of Genesis describes God's call to Abram (who would later be called Abraham). God instructs Abram to leave his home and set out to a land that God had chosen for him. Abram's response is an ancient example of good stewardship. Instead of clinging to his comfortable home and way of life, he recognizes that all he has is a gift from God, puts his trust in God, and obeys. And God rewards him saying, "I will make your name great, so that you will be a blessing."

To "be a blessing" is the true aim of a stewardship way of life. It is also an excellent way to live out the season of Lent. The sacrifices we take on, the spiritual disciplines we practice, and the extra acts of service we perform during this season — all give glory to God and transform our lives into a blessing for others.

Lest we grow weary on this path, our Gospel passage today, from Matthew, offers us a powerful image of the great God we serve. It is the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus, when our Lord reveals Himself in His true glory and the Father says, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." The apostles who witnessed this were awestruck. But our loving Savior reassured them saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid."

As we continue our Lenten journey, let us take these two verses, "Listen to him," "Rise, and do not be afraid" to heart. Let us rely on God's strength to aid us in our spiritual disciplines as we move through Lent. We will arrive at Easter with deeper holiness, as a blessing to God and others — and as better stewards of all God's gifts to us.

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Pastor's Corner

As some of you may know, I've been thinking a lot about fasting these days. Fasting is one of the three great practices during Lent, along with prayer and almsgiving. Fasting is also an ancient part of our tradition with its roots in the Judaism. Although we often speak of fasting in metaphorical ideas, like fasting from vices and bad habits, I am specifically referring to food. It is for us a form of penance and contrition while also helping us to understand a sense of emptying ourselves so as to be filled with Jesus the Christ. Fasting also helps us understand more deeply the struggle so many in our world experience through lack of food and starvation.

I must admit, I've never really questioned the importance of fasting, probably because I have never been a big eater. Nevertheless, I don't like feeling hungry and enjoy a good home-cooked meal. This Lent I am doing some serious spiritual cleaning and plan to focus on fasting as the principle way to rid myself of some unwanted spiritual pounds, as well as some real pounds. I encourage everyone to take seriously the practice of fasting this Lent, offering our fast as a sacrifice to the Lord who gives us his food for the journey.



Liturgy and Music Corner Reflection #17 on Desiderio Desideravi, Ars celebrandi - The Art of Celebrating

Ars celebrandi is not simply a set of rubrics (instructions), nor should it be thought of as imaginative...creativity without rules. "The rite is in itself a norm, and the norm is never an end in itself, but it is always at the service of a higher reality that it means to protect."

Ars celebrandi requires different kinds of knowledge. First of all, it requires an understanding of the "dynamism that unfolds through the Liturgy." By this he means, "the Paschal Mystery is made present so that the baptized, through their participation, can experience it in their own lives." Otherwise, he warns that the celebration can devolve into a outward, rigid ritual.

Secondly, Pope Francis says that, "...it is necessary to know how the Holy Spirit acts in every celebration." Ars celebrandi "...must be in harmony with the action of the Spirit." This allows that the Liturgy will be free from "subjectivisms" that result in individual tastes dominating it's celebration.

"Finally, it is necessary to understand the dynamics of symbolic language, its particular nature, its efficacy."

These three things ought to make it clear that the art of celebration is not something that can be improvised. How is the art of celebration to be learned? He starts with a negative observation. "One does not learn the art of celebrating by frequenting a course in public speaking or in persuasive techniques of communication." Those are tools, and can be useful. But, they must be "at the service of the Liturgy and the action of the Holy Spirit." We must be dedicated to the celebration, and allow the celebration to convey to us its art.

Next time we ask the question, "Who is it that celebrates?"



A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥63 (Luke 路13:18-21) Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

Evangelization without connotation is just a show. It only can make people intoxicated for a while. When they encounter difficulties in life, they will immediately fall down. St. Paul said: "If I speak in the tongues of humans and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal." (1 Cor 13:1)

Evangelization, first of all, must have connotation, i.e. love for God and people. In other words, loving the word of God and practicing it in daily life. This life then will be a profound external life.

The two parables of the mustard seed and the yeast demonstrate the inner and outer situations of evangelization and testimony. In Israel, the work of kneading the dough is left to the woman: "It is like leaven which a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened." 1 Thes 5:23 can help us to understand what these three measures of flour imply: "May the God of peace himself sanctify you wholly; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."

First of all, the woman symbolizes the church, and the three measures of flour can be understood in terms of spirit, soul, and body. In Greek, "spirit" (pneuma) means the rational part of humans that possesses the power of perceiving and grasping divine and eternal things, and upon which the Holy Spirit exerts God's influence. The term "soul" (psychē) means earthly life or simply life. Finally, "body" (sōma) indicates the living body, not the dead. The spirit of the gospel, like leaven, nurtures all lives, in and out, until they are transformed.

The parable of the mustard seed reminds Christians of the fact that the spirit of the kingdom lies in humility, as manifested in the incarnation of Jesus. It is God who makes the church grow so that she can accommodate all people in order to offer a place for eternal rest. What fuels the growth of the mustard seed is the church's connotative evangelization and life testimony. This witness to God will become a blessing to the world.

福傳,先有內涵,就是對主對人的愛;愛聖言,讓聖言活在生命,這活,是有深度的外在生命。

芥子與酵母兩個比喻,說明基督徒福傳內在與外在並重,內在如同酵母的精神,外在就是芥子長大以後給世界的 祝福。

"酵母"指向天國內在成長,在以色列,揉麵是留給女人承擔: "女人取來藏在三鬥面中,直到全部發酵。"三 鬥面的意義可以參考得前5:23裡面所提到: "願賜平安的天主親自完全聖化你們,將你們整個的神魂、靈魂和肉 身,在我們的主耶穌基督來臨時,保持的無瑕可指。"

首先女人像徵教會,而三鬥面可以用神魂、靈魂與肉身來理解。在希臘版中,"神魂"(pneuma)意即精神,指 人的理性,具有感知和把握神聖永恆事物的能力,聖神在其上導航生命。"靈魂"(psychē)本意是生命,或塵 世生命;而"肉身"(sōma)解作活著的身體不是屍體。福音精神如同酵母一樣,讓全人都獲得救恩,最終生命 得到轉化。

芥子的比喻提醒基督徒一個事實,天國精神在于謙卑,如耶穌降生成為嬰兒。使教會成長的是天主,到達成熟季 節,能讓所有人完全安息的地方。助長芥子成長的,是教會奉獻有內涵的福傳與生活見證。


