# **The Humble Instrument**

Sister Faustina was a young, uneducated nun in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland during the 1930s. She came from a poor family that struggled during the years of World War I. She had only three years of simple education, so hers were the humblest tasks in the convent, usually in the kitchen or garden. However, she received extraordinary revelations — or messages — from our Lord Jesus. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to record these experiences, which she compiled into notebooks. These notebooks are known today as the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, and the words contained within are God's loving message of Divine Mercy.

Though the Divine Mercy message is not new to the teachings of the Church, Sr. Faustina's *Diary* sparked a great movement, and a strong and significant focus on the mercy of Christ. Saint John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina in 2000 making her the "first saint of the new millennium." Speaking of Sr. Faustina and the importance of the message contained in her *Diary*, the Pope call her "the great apostle of Divine Mercy in our time."Today, we continue to rely of St. Faustina as a constant reminder of the message to trust in Jesus' endless mercy, and to live life mercifully toward others. ~Visit thedivinemercy.org for more information.~

# 17 Things Jesus Revealed to St. Faustina About Divine Mercy

As a person, as a country, as a world, do we not need God's mercy more and more in these times? For the sake of our souls, can we afford not to listen to what Jesus told us through St. Faustina about his mercy and what our response to is should be?

Benedict told us "It is a really central message for our time: Mercy as the force of God, as the divine limit against the evil of the world."

Let's remind ourselves right now. Or learn the highlights for the first time. Divine Mercy Sunday is the perfect day to start listening to what Jesus himself tells us:

- (1) I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. *Diary* 699 [Note: confession does not have to be done on the Sunday itself. Beforehand is fine]
- (2) Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My Mercy. —St. Faustina's Diary 300
- (3) Let all mankind recognize My unfathomable mercy. It is a sign for the end times; after it will come the day of justice. *Diary* 848
- (4) He who refuses to pass through the door of My mercy must pass through the door of My justice... Diary 1146
- (5) Souls perish in spite of My bitter Passion. I am giving them the last hope of salvation; that is, the Feast of My Mercy. If they will not adore My mercy, they will perish for all eternity. Diary 965
- (6) My Heart overflows with great mercy for souls, and especially for poor sinners. If only they could understand that I am the best of Fathers to them and that it is for them that the Blood and Water flowed from My Heart as from a fount overflowing with mercy. *Diary* 367
- (7) These rays shield souls from the wrath of My Father. Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him. I desire that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy. Diary 299
- (8) My daughter, write that the greater the misery of a soul, the greater its right to My mercy; [urge] all souls to trust in the unfathomable abyss of My mercy, because I want to save them all. Diary 1182
- (9) The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy. My mercy is confirmed in every work of My hands. He who trusts in My mercy will not perish, for all his affairs are Mine, and his enemies will be shattered at the base of My footstool. *Diary* 723
- (10) [Let] the greatest sinners place their trust in My mercy. They have the right before others to trust in the abyss of My mercy. My daughter, write about My mercy towards tormented souls. Souls that make an appeal to My mercy delight Me. To such souls I grant even more graces than they ask. I cannot punish even the greatest sinner if he makes an appeal to My compassion, but on the contrary, I justify him in My unfathomable and inscrutable mercy. Diary 1146
- (11) I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy. *Diary* 1109
- (12) I desire trust from My creatures. Encourage souls to place great trust in My fathomless mercy. Let the weak, sinful soul have no fear to approach Me, for even if it had more sins than there are grains of sand in the world, all would be drowned in the unmeasurable depths of My mercy. *Diary* 1059
- (13) I demand the worship of My mercy through the solemn celebration of the Feast and through the veneration of the image which is painted. By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works. *Diary* 742
- (14) Tell [all people], My daughter, that I am Love and Mercy itself. When a soul approaches Me with trust, I fill it with such an abundance of graces that it cannot contain them within itself, but radiates them to other souls. Jesus, *Diary* 1074
- (15) I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: "Jesus, I trust in You." *Diary* 327
- (16) I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory. Jesus, *Diary* 48
- (17) Souls who spread the honor of My mercy I shield through their entire lives as a tender mother her infant, and at the hour of death I will not be a Judge for them, but the Merciful Savior. At that last hour, a soul has nothing with which to defend itself except My mercy. Happy is the soul that during its lifetime immersed itself in the Fountain of Mercy, because justice will have no hold on it. *Diary* 1075

# MYSTAGOGY

# Is there Really a Six, a Seven, an Eighteen, and a Twenty-Decade Rosary?

Most Catholics are familiar with the fifteen-decade Rosary of Saint Dominic, into which Saint John-Paul II inserted an additional five-decades of "Luminous Mysteries" in 2002. What is not so well known is that St. Dominic was not the first to promote or to pray the Rosary. Like many things in our Catholic history, the Rosary underwent a complex history of development over an extended period of time, and there are many different forms of it. The Blessed Virgin did not give the Rosary to Saint Dominic as an entirely new devotion; She merely gave him a nuanced and now common form of the prayer. In addition, She commissioned him to promote the Rosary as a way of renewing the Church and combating the Albigensian heresy.

A little over a hundred years later Saint Bridget of Sweden promoted "The Bridgittine Rosary", an eighteen decade rosary consisting of the traditional fifteen decades of the Dominican Rosary plus three additional mysteries, an extra mystery for each section. The first Joyful mystery was the Immaculate Conception, the sixth Sorrowful Mystery was "The Body of the Lord being placed in the arms of His sorrowful Mother", and the sixth Glorious Mystery was "The Patronage of Mary, Mediatrix of All Graces". Another eighteen decade Rosary (composed of three six-decade sections) was "The Carmelite Rosary"; it was identical to the Bridgittine Rosary in all essentials except that the sixth Glorious Mystery was "The Patronage of Mary, Queen and Beauty of Carmel". At Lourdes the Blessed Mother appeared with a six-decade Rosary in Her hands; when Saint Bernadette queried Her about Her unusual Rosary, the Blessed Mother said the sixth decade should be offered for the souls in Purgatory.

The Franciscans use a seven decade Rosary, The Franciscan Crown Rosary, which focuses on the Seven Joys of Mary. It is similar to the five Joyful Mysteries of the Dominican Rosary, but the "The Visit of the Magi" follows the Nativity instead of The Visitation. The sixth decade depicts Jesus' first appearance to His Mother after the Resurrection, and the seventh decade combines the Assumption of Mary into Heaven with Her Crowning Queen of Heaven in one decade.

Then there is "The Rosary of the Seven Sorrows of Mary ", or "The Servite Rosary". This Rosary is comprised of seven sorrowful mysteries of seven Hail Mary's each, followed by an "Our Father" with no "Glory be". This Rosary was once common, but fell out of usage until Mary appeared in Rwanda in the 1980's ahead of the genocide that took place in 1994. Mary commissioned the visionaries to pray and promote the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows as a way to combat the wickedness in the world that will eventually precipitate a time of unconscionable trouble for humanity if they did not repent of their sins. The tragic events that followed less than a decade later in Rwanda were but a microcosm of what will befall the earth if humanity does not heed Mary's motherly warning to amend their ways before it is too late.

Nearly all of the approved apparitions of Mary in the world have promoted the Rosary in one form or another as a way of combating the world's evils and turning back the wrath of God. In 1973 in Akita Japan, Mary warned that if the sins of humanity increased in number and intensity there would soon be no more forgiveness for them, and a time of grave trouble would befall the world in which "The only arms for you will be the Rosary and the sign left by my Son". She admonished Her children, "Each day recite the prayers of the Rosary".

In these uncertain times, when there is so much confusion in the Church regarding Her teaching and practice; when many economists repeatedly warn that a global economic collapse seems probable and perhaps imminent; when it seems that almost every day we hear reports of gun violence on our streets, rampant racism, unrestrained immorality, and the complete breakdown of anything remotely commensurate with godly values; when one wonders if we are not on the brink of another world war, should we not once again consider taking up the Rosary as a way of combating all these evils?

Pope Saint John Paul II wrote on the Rosary just before his death in 2005: "The Rosary is my favorite prayer . . . Today I willingly entrust to the power of this prayer . . . the cause of peace in the world and the cause of the family . . . the Rosary is by its very nature a prayer for peace . . . the Rosary allows us to hope that, even today, the difficult 'battle' for peace can be won . . . I look to all of you, brothers and sisters of every state of life . . . confidently take up the Rosary once again" (*Rosarium Virginis Mariae*, On The Most Holy Rosary, no. 2, 39f., 43).

A Google search of any of the different forms of the Rosary mentioned above will direct one to a basic explanation of the particulars related to them.

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
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
