

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



Our Psalm today, “The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy,” sheds light on our glorious

Gospel reading about the healing of the blind man, Bartimaeus.

We can learn a lot from Bartimaeus when it comes to our own personal relationships with Jesus. Many of us struggle with something from which we need healing — physical blindness, illness, addiction, bad habits, anger, sin. In our weakness, do we confidently cry out to Jesus knowing that He will help us? Oftentimes we begin to, but then a voice in our thoughts tells us to doubt and encourages us to stop trying, like the crowd in our Gospel. Although that voice is persistent and strong, we are called to cry out all the more. If Jesus can hear one voice in a crowd of many, then He can hear our direct prayer to Him in our hearts.

Our Gospel story closes with the miraculous moment when Bartimaeus is healed. The conversation with Jesus was simple. Jesus asked Bartimaeus what he would like Him to do. This man, blind for who knows how many years, desired sight. Jesus responded, “Go your way; your faith has saved you.” He was healed and continued to follow Christ.

There was not much that Bartimaeus had to do to become healed. All he needed was his undoubting faith.

Whatever it is that we are struggling with in this life, all Jesus asks of us is to have faith in Him. As a result, we will remain steadfast in our relationship with Christ and will have the strength to keep going. And although we might not be healed in this life, Jesus still hears our confident cries. And through our faith we will surely be healed in the next.

SEÑALES EXTRAORDINARIOS

Ha aprendido todo sobre las señales y símbolos de la vida cotidiana o los señales ordinarios. Pero los sacramentos no son señales ordinarios, son diferentes de cualquier otra señal en el mundo. Esto se debe a que los sacramentos son señales que realmente pueden producir lo que representan. Los señales ordinarios no pueden hacer esto. Por ejemplo, el humo puede decirnos que está algo en fuego, pero no causa el fuego. Los pájaros que volando hacia el sur pueden ser una señal de que viene el invierno, pero no causan el invierno. Los sacramentos, por otro lado, realmente producen lo que representan. El bautismo es una señal de limpieza del pecado y también causa la limpieza del pecado.

PEOPLE OF GRACE

Out of all of God's creatures, only human beings are created in the image and likeness of God. We are the only ones who can know and love our creator! And we are the only ones who can receive the Sacraments—signs instituted by Christ that give us His grace.

This year, our families will create a representation of each person in their family. Each month, a "Grace Person" activity will guide us to decorate or create symbols of the grace we receive, and add them to the grace people. These will become visual reminders of our learning and growing in relationship with Jesus through the Sacraments.

MEMORY VERSE

1 JOHN 4:8

"Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love."

EXTRAORDINARY SIGNS

You have learned all about signs and symbols in everyday life, or ordinary signs. But the Sacraments are not ordinary signs—they are different from every other sign in the world. This is because the Sacraments are signs that can actually bring about what they represent. Ordinary signs can't do this. For example, smoke can tell us that fire exists, but it does not cause fire. Or birds flying south can be a sign of winter coming, but they do not cause winter to come. Sacraments on the other hand, actually bring about what they represent. Baptism is a sign of cleansing from sin, and it also causes cleansing from sin.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS - Giving as God does

Ask yourself this question — what would you pray for if you really believed God could and would do anything for you?

In my experience, we all have something. We all have that miracle we're afraid to request, afraid we will be disappointed.

Do we doubt God's readiness to give because we ourselves have such an imperfect understanding of charity and love? Maybe if we had better faith in God we would be more ready to give of ourselves — and maybe if we were more ready to give of ourselves, we would understand more clearly the ways of God.

Because we're not really afraid that God can't do something. We know He can do anything. What we're afraid of is that He will do what He always does: give us what we need, not what we want.

Have you ever had a friend in need and you just wanted to give them something — a meal, a phone call, a text? Not because you knew it would help, but simply because you wanted to reach out. And have they ever said to you: It wasn't so much what you gave, but the fact that you did. You gave them what they needed even if it wasn't what they specifically asked for.

When we give in this manner, we are giving as God does. Sometimes we are afraid to ask because we don't want to be disappointed. But remember, the blind man on the road got what he asked for, but he would have gotten what he needed even if his answer had been the opposite. God's generosity is always reckless, and it's always perfect. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS

因為我們自己對慈善和愛的不完全的理解，而懷疑天主會給我們祂所預備好的？也許我們對天主有更好的信德，我們就會更願意奉獻我們自己，也許我們越是準備好奉獻自己，我們就越清楚明瞭天主的方式。

因著我們不真的害怕天主祂所不會做的事情。我們知道他是全能的主，我們害怕的是，祂必實行祂的旨意：是給我們所需要的，而

不是給我們所想要的。

你有沒有朋友是需要幫助的，而你是可以給他們些東西 - 如一餐飯，一個電話，一個短訊？不是因為你知道這樣對他們有所幫助，而你只是為了想伸出援手，他們有曾經對你說：不是你給予了很多，而是你確實做到了甚麼，你給了祂們所需要的，即使這不是他們所特別要求的。

當我們以這樣的態度給予時，我們就是如同天主的給予，有時候我們不敢去要求，因為我們不願失望，但是請記住，瞎眼在路上得到所求之事，就算他得到的回答是相反的，但他總是得到他所需要的，上主總是恣意的施予慷慨，而且總也是那麼的完美。
