




Prayer in action

In today's gospel reading, we see a beautiful example of the dynamics of prayer. Jesus begins His day in prayerful solitude before His disciples come to summon Him for a day of preaching and casting out demons. I turn to this passage often in my own prayer life. I can often get caught up trying to prioritize my outward ministry over my personal prayer life. Sometimes I think taking time from my ministries or my time with others for personal prayer is selfish. That is time I could be giving to someone else. In today's reading, Jesus stands in stark contrast of that mentality. Jesus, whom we believe to be the most "useful" human to ever walk the earth (to put it lightly), took time from His ministry for personal prayer. Do I think I somehow need prayer less than Jesus did? This reading challenges me and reminds me that prayer needs to be the center and source of all that I do. As members of the Cathedral Young Adults have been called to serve the parish through our Welcoming Committee and Live Stream ministries during this COVID-19 pandemic, we have also acknowledged the need for those ministries to be rooted and fueled by personal prayer and a personal connection with Christ.

In our Gospel reading this Sunday, we see the beautiful healing of Simon Peter's mother-in-law. The people who love her invite to her bedside the "Foundation of Love," Jesus the Christ. She is lifted up and returned to the embrace of her family. Her response to this healing gift is to offer the gifts given to her back to the only one who can truly give. As a good steward, she looks after Jesus and serves him.

Peter's mother-in-law models one of the great metaphors for how to be a disciple; being a steward. A steward is both someone who cares for and serves others (as in our old word 'stewardess'), as well as someone who looks after the property of someone else. Jesus frequently uses this image of steward to reveal what it means to be a disciple. He lives out His life as a steward, caring for the needs of others and serving them, as well as sharing parables about stewards who have been put in charge of property, vineyards, money, or talents. Ultimately, Jesus reveals that all things are created by the Father and belong to the Father. We humans have been given the high calling of serving the Father by caring for, being stewards of, all His creation. We've been put in charge. We are not the owners of any of it, but rather the stewards of it.

Jesus tells many parables about how we are called to be the stewards of God's creation. Often, these parables reveal how we are failing at our calling because we act as if what belongs to the Father is ours. In fact, Jesus' own presence will reveal that not only have we been poor stewards, but even worse, we live as though the Father serves us and should care for *our* possessions. Jesus' very life sheds light on how upside-down humans are living and how out of harmony they are with the rest of creation.

The Father's hope is that we will experience the healing love of His Son just as Peter's mother-in-law did. To experience this love, to live in harmony with the Father and His creation, simply requires that we accept our vocation as stewards and strive to take care of the beauty of all that has been entrusted to us. We care for the Church, other people, and nature in the joy of knowing that when the Son returns, all that the Father has created will truly glorify its Creator.

Stewards of God's creation

Mayordomos de la Creación de Dios

En nuestra lectura del Evangelio de este domingo, vemos la hermosa curación de la suegra de Simón Pedro. Las personas que la aman la invitan a su cama al “Fundamento del Amor”, Jesús el Cristo. Ella es elevada y devuelta al abrazo de su familia. Su respuesta a este don de sanación es ofrecer los dones que se le han dado al único que realmente puede dar. Como buena administradora, cuida a Jesús y le sirve. La suegra de Pedro ejemplifica una de las grandes metáforas de cómo ser discípulo; ser un mayordomo. Un mayordomo es por lo tanto alguien que cuida y sirve a los demás (como en nuestra antigua palabra "azafata"), así como alguien que cuida la propiedad de otra persona. Jesús usa con frecuencia esta imagen de mayordomo para revelar lo que significa ser un discípulo. Él vive su vida como mayordomo, cuidando de las necesidades de los demás y sirviéndoles, además de compartir parábolas sobre los mayordomos que han sido puestos a cargo de propiedades, viñedos, dinero o talentos. Finalmente, Jesús revela que todas las cosas son creadas por el Padre y pertenecen al Padre. A los seres humanos se nos ha dado el alto llamado de servir al Padre cuidando y siendo mayordomos de toda Su creación. Nos han puesto a cargo. No somos los dueños de nada de eso, sino sus administradores.

Jesús cuenta muchas parábolas sobre cómo estamos llamados a ser los administradores de la creación de Dios. A menudo, estas parábolas revelan cómo estamos fallando en nuestro llamado porque actuamos como si lo que pertenece al Padre fuera nuestro. De hecho, la propia presencia de Jesús revelará que no solo hemos sido malos mayordomos, sino que, lo que es peor, vivimos como si el Padre nos sirviera y cuidará de nuestras posesiones. La vida misma de Jesús arroja luz sobre cómo viven los humanos al revés y qué tan fuera de armonía están con el resto de la creación.

La esperanza del Padre es que experimentemos el amor sanador de Su Hijo tal como lo hizo la suegra de Pedro. Experimentar este amor, vivir en armonía con el Padre y su creación, simplemente requiere que aceptemos nuestra vocación de mayordomos y nos esforcemos por cuidar la belleza de todo lo que se nos ha confiado. Nos preocupamos por la Iglesia, otras personas y la naturaleza con el gozo de saber que cuando el Hijo regrese, todo lo que el Padre ha creado realmente glorificará a su Creador.

Saint Josephine was born in Sudan, where her uncle was a tribal chief. She was kidnapped and sold as a slave. Owner after owner subjected her to severe mistreatment. She was taken to Italy, where she learned about God while staying at a convent of the Canossian Daughters of Charity (Canossian Sisters). The sisters helped her gain her freedom. She asked to be baptized and soon joined the sisters, where she prepared other sisters to be missionaries to Africa. Her feast day is February 8. She is the Patron Saint of trafficked persons.

Durante unas seis semanas antes de Pascua, los católicos observan la temporada de Cuaresma. El primer día de Cuaresma varía, este año comienza el 17 de febrero con el Miércoles de Ceniza. MOVING INTO LENT

For about six weeks before Easter, Catholics observe the season of Lent. The first day of Lent varies, this year beginning February 17th with Ash Wednesday. Lent is a penitential season when Catholics practice prayer, fasting, and alms-giving as a way of preparing to enter into the Paschal Mystery and the celebration of Easter by re-newing our Baptismal Vows and learning how to live them more faithfully during the Easter Season.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS - The Audacity of Holiness

Do you know a holy person? I'm not talking about piety — that's important, too, in its own way. But right now, I'm speaking of holiness. St. Therese of Lisieux called holiness "a disposition of the heart that makes us humble and little in the arms of God, aware of our weakness, and confident — in the most audacious way — in His Fatherly goodness."

The holy person sees a storm on the horizon of life, and rather than give themselves over to fear and despair (natural and understandable reactions), regards the gathering winds as an opportunity to rely more fully on God. The holy person takes a bad situation and sanctifies it with charity and understanding that defies our fallen human nature.


Peter's mother-in-law was still in the throes of a fever when Jesus grasped her hand. It wasn't until she took his hand and allowed him to help her up that "the fever left her and she waited on them."

Before the fever could leave her, she had to commit to holiness — to put her trust in him in a most audacious way. She had to find it within herself to lift her weakened hand to grasp his — and as soon as she did, she was rewarded. Her bodily health restored, she gave thanks and attended to his needs.

God's hand is always outstretched to us. Will we take it, even if the fever of sin and pride and worldly concerns rages in our souls? Will we muster the strength? Will we be audacious enough to have confidence in His Fatherly goodness?

你可曾認識一位聖人嗎? 我現在不是在談虔誠, 虔誠本身也是很重要的。但我在談的是聖潔。

里修鎮的聖女小德蘭(聖小德肋撒)稱聖潔是, "在天主的臂彎內使人心謙卑而渺小的氣質。意識到我們的軟弱, 但大膽的一對天父的仁慈充滿信心。"

聖人看到生活地平線上的風暴, 而不是讓自己陷入恐懼和絕望, (這是自然而可以理解的反應), 而視風暴的聚集為一個更充分依靠上主的機會。聖人身處惡境, 會用慈善和諒解使之聖化, 以抵抗人類本性的墮落。

當耶穌緊握住仍在痛苦發燒的伯多祿岳母的手時, 發燒並未退

去, 岳母等待著, 她握住耶穌的手並讓祂來幫助自己, 而此時發燒便退去。在退燒之前, 她必須保持聖潔的心- 用放心大膽的方式信賴祂, 找出內心的力量伸出虛弱的手去握住祂- 很快的在握住之後得到了回報, 岳母的身體康復了, 她感謝耶穌, 並照顧祂的所需。

上主的手總是像我們伸出來, 即使在我們的靈魂中有著狂熱的罪惡和驕傲, 及世俗的憂慮憤怒, 我們會接受祂嗎? 我們會鼓起勇氣嗎? 我們會放心大膽對天父的仁慈有信心嗎?
