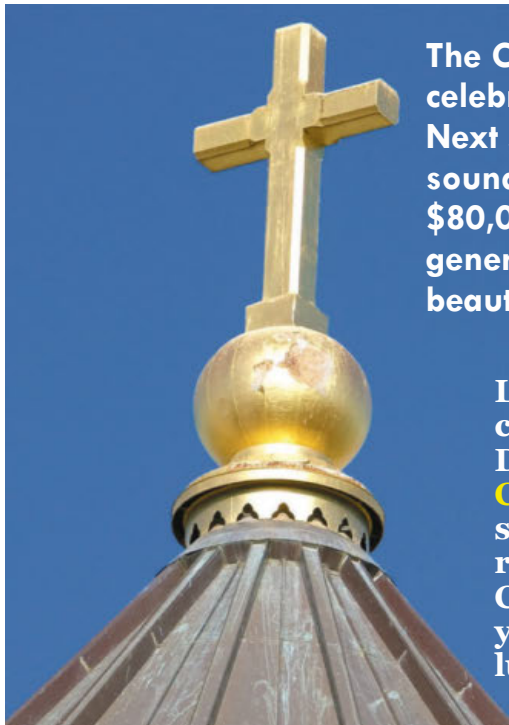

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥130 (Mark谷 3:1-6)

什麼是真愛？

愛的重點不是為樂而愛；相反，是為愛而愛。換言之，愛不是因為對方討好自己，愛是因為愛，或更準確地說，是分享天主的愛。因此，即使仇人看來不可愛，也不想去愛，但基督徒仍然可以有愛的人。當基督徒愛仇時，會獲得完美的愛和喜樂，這是內心徹底平安，沒有任何事物能夠破壞來自天主的內心平安。無論世界充滿敵意，儘管耶穌被釘在十字架上，但祂仍然愛所有罪人。

安息日，耶穌在會堂裡遇見患枯手症的人，耶穌大發慈悲治療他，法利塞人卻“窺察耶穌是否在安息日治好那人，好去控告他”。這種情況下，虛假宗教領導眼中，連耶穌的慈悲也變成罪。不管怎樣；耶穌仍吩咐病人站在中間，準備醫治他；然後質疑眾人：“安息日許行善呢，或作惡呢？許救命呢，或害命呢？”耶穌一針見血講述有關安息日真理，即行善和救命，而不是禁止幫助有需要者然後來給天主奉獻祭品。

動詞“救”（sōcai）意即救人於病痛，醫治病人直到健康。然而，那些比梅瑟制定更多法律的法利塞人，卻判斷耶穌在安息日治病是犯罪，因為按照他們錯誤宗教理解，安息日是敬拜天主日子，不能照顧有需要者。

耶穌解開病人鎖鏈，讓他體驗天主慈悲臨在；這才是真正安息日的慶典。事實上，迫害者拒絕遵循耶穌慶祝安息日的方式，他們“立刻便與黑落德黨人作陷害耶穌的商討，為除滅他”。

安息日，行善救人是履行法律的不二途徑，正如守齋精神不在乎不吃肉改吃魚，而是行善避惡。即使耶穌被人釘死，也不會停止愛護罪人，直到時間終結。

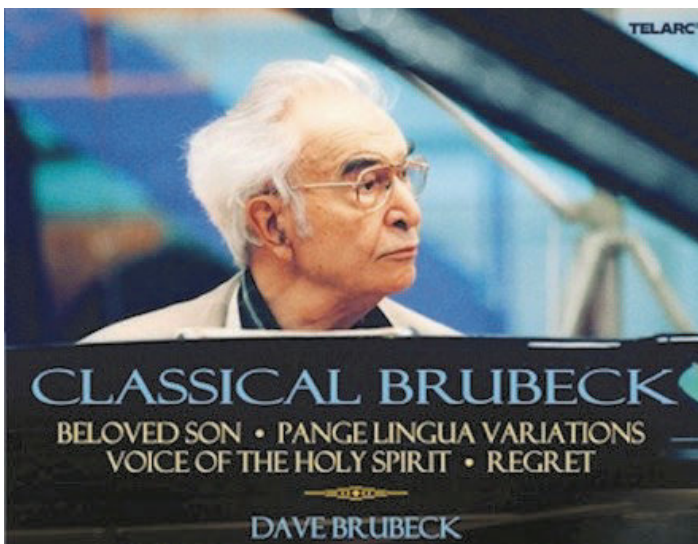

In 1983 the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament commissioned legendary musician Dave Brubeck to compose a variation of the Thomas Aquinas hymn “Pange Lingua, Gloriosi” (“Sing, My Tongue, the Savior’s Glory”). The work beautifully captures the poetic spirit of the original Gregorian chant combined with jazz interludes. It was Brubeck’s first sacred composition since he had converted to Catholicism. The Dave Brubeck Quartet first performed the work in the Cathedral with orchestra and chorus over two nights in May 1983 to sell-out audiences.



On July 6 the Emmy-nominated Chris Brubeck Trio (Dave’s sons) will join the Cathedral Choir and Orchestra to recreate this beautiful work in a Eucharistic Revival Concert. Tickets are now on sale at <https://cbsac.ticketspice.com/brubeck>. Ticket prices range from \$25 to \$75. A wine-and-cheese reception will precede the concert at a cost of \$50.



Education in Faith

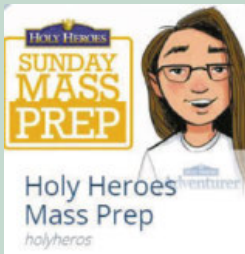
Keep growing in your faith as you take time away from school and work and focus on being together as a family. Here are some ways to stay connected with your faith while enjoying your Summer!

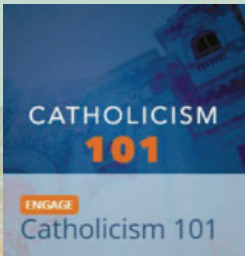

Focus of the Gospel:

The Gospel next Sunday we read, "So he (Jesus) was not able to perform any mighty deed there, ... He was amazed at their lack of faith." Jesus had just returned to visit family in his home town of Nazareth. The people there knew him well, having watched Jesus grow up, and did not find anything extraordinary about him. Yet, they have been hearing amazing stories of signs and wonders that he was performing. As Jesus spoke to them, they could not believe His words were coming from Him; they still saw Jesus as one of them; nothing special to see here: a Nazorean. The fact He could not perform many works was not a deficit of His power, but rather God's respect of our free will. God will not act boldly in our lives without our permission. Resigning ourselves in faith that Jesus can work in our lives is key.

En el Evangelio del próximo domingo leemos: "Así que (Jesús) no pudo realizar allí ninguna hazaña, ... Se asombró de la falta de fe de ellos". Jesús acababa de visitar a su familia en Nazaret, su ciudad natal. La gente de allí lo conocía bien, pues habían visto crecer a Jesús, y no encontraban nada extraordinario en él. Sin embargo, habían estado oyendo historias asombrosas de señales y prodigios que realizaba. Mientras Jesús les hablaba, no podían creer que sus palabras vinieran de Él; seguían viendo a Jesús como uno de ellos; nada especial que ver: un nazareano. El hecho de que no pudiera realizar muchas obras no era un déficit de su poder, sino más bien el respeto de Dios a nuestro libre albedrío. Dios no actuará audazmente en nuestras vidas sin nuestro permiso. Resignarnos con fe a que Jesús pueda obrar en nuestras vidas es la clave.

- Help youth to understand social issues
- Collaborate w/others in parish life to make room for youth to serve
- Cultivate pathways for leadership development among youth
- Align ministries with Church teaching on youth ministry

FIRST READING

NEH 8: 1-4A, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra the priest brought the law before the Assembly, which consisted of men, women, and those children old enough to understand. Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Water Gate, he read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law.

Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion. He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it—for he was standing higher up than any of the people—and, as he opened it, all the people rose. Ezra blessed the Lord, the Great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, “Amen, amen!” Then they bowed down and prostrated themselves before the Lord, their faces to the ground.

Ezra read plainly from the book of the law of God, interpreting it so that all could understand what was read. Then Nehemiah, that is, His Excellency, and Ezra the priest-scribe and the Levites who were instructing the people said to all the people:

“Today is holy to the Lord your God. Do not be sad, and do not weep”—for all the people were weeping as they heard the words of the law.

He said further: “Go eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared, for today is holy to our Lord. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength.

Beloved:

Come to him, a living stone, rejected by human beings but chosen and precious in the sight of God, and, like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

For it says in Scripture: “Behold, I am laying a stone in Zion, a cornerstone, chosen and precious, and whoever believes in it shall not be put to shame.”

Therefore, its value is for you who have faith, but for those without faith, “The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone, and a stone that will make people stumble, and a rock that will make them fall.” They stumble by disobeying the word, as is their destiny.

DEDICACIÓN DE LA CATEDRAL 30 DE JUNIO DE 2024

PRIMERA LECTURA

NEHEMÍAS 8, 2-4A. 5-6. 8-10

En aquellos días, el sacerdote Esdras trajo el libro de la Ley ante la asamblea, compuesta de hombres, mujeres y todos los que tenían uso de razón. Era mediados del mes séptimo. En la plaza de la Puerta del Agua, desde el amanecer hasta el mediodía, estuvo leyendo el libro a los hombres, a las mujeres y a los que tenían uso de razón. Toda la gente seguía con atención la lectura de la Ley.

Esdras, el escriba, estaba de pie en el púlpito de madera que había hecho para esta ocasión. Esdras abrió el libro a la vista de todo el pueblo -pues se hallaba en un puesto elevado- y, cuando lo abrió, toda la gente se puso en pie. Esdras bendijo al Señor, Dios grande, y todo el pueblo, levantando las manos, respondió:

«Amén, amén.»

Después se inclinaron y adoraron al Señor, rostro en tierra. Los levitas leían el libro de la ley de Dios con claridad y explicando el sentido, de forma que comprendieron la lectura. Nehemías, el gobernador, Esdras, el sacerdote y escriba, y los levitas que enseñaban al pueblo decían al pueblo entero:

- «Hoy es un día consagrado a nuestro Dios: No hagáis duelo ni lloréis.» Porque el pueblo entero lloraba al escuchar las palabras de la Ley. Y añadieron:- «Andad, comed buenas tajadas, bebed vino dulce y enviad porciones a quien no tiene, pues es un día consagrado a nuestro Dios. No estéis tristes, pues el gozo en el Señor es vuestra fortaleza

SEGUNDA LECTURA

1 PEDRO 2: 4-9

Hermanos: Acérquense al Señor Jesús, la piedra viva, rechazada

por los hombres, pero escogida y preciosa a los ojos de Dios; porque ustedes también son piedras vivas, que van entrando en la edificación del templo espiritual, para formar un sacerdocio santo, destinado a ofrecer sacrificios espirituales, agradables a Dios, por medio de Jesucristo. Tengan presente que está escrito: He aquí que pongo en Sión una piedra angular, escogida y preciosa; el que crea en ella no quedará defraudado.

Dichosos, pues, ustedes, los que han creído. 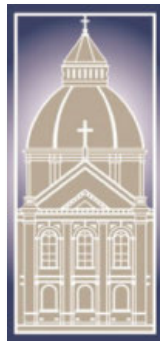
