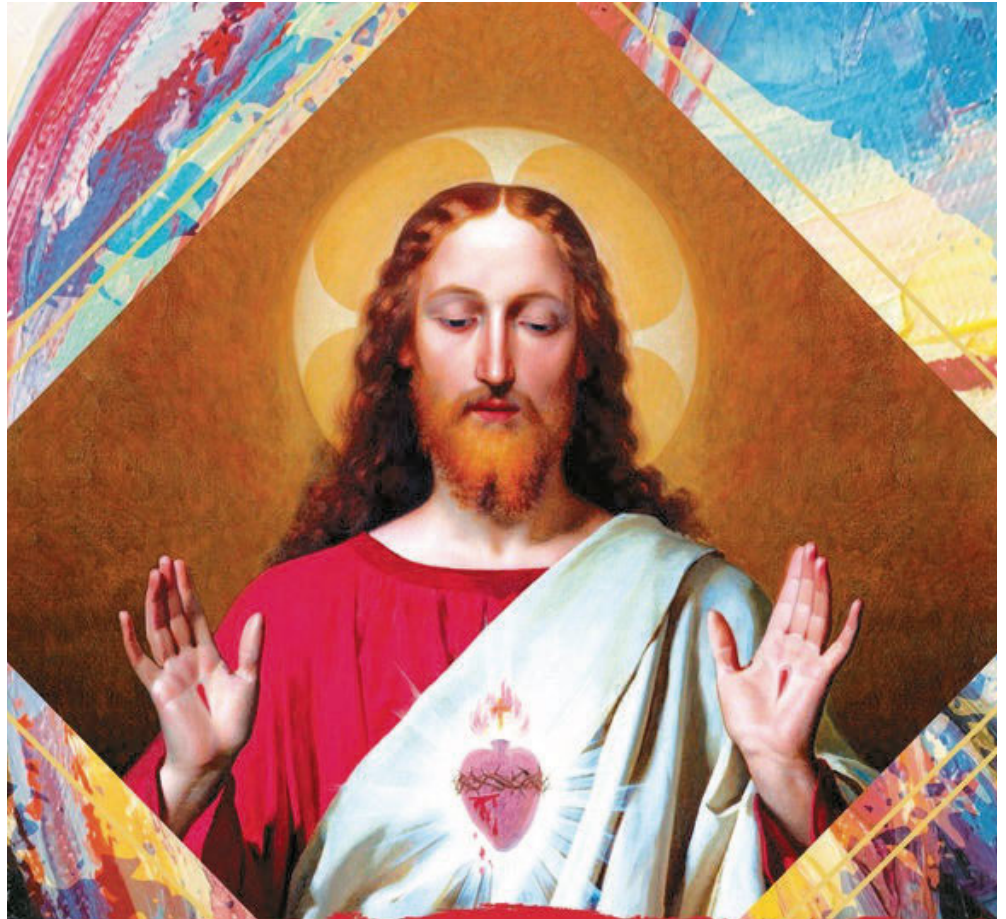

The Cathedral's Stewardship Retreat

On March 9, the Cathedral held its fourth stewardship retreat with the theme "Growing Closer to Christ Through Personal Prayer." Fr. Joel Sember from the Green Bay Diocese in Wisconsin served as the retreat's spiritual director. Over 170 participants from the Cathedral and neighboring parishes attended.

The retreat started with a very spiritual opening Bilingual Mass with Fr. Joel presiding and Fr. Michael O'Reilly concelebrating. Following Mass, the retreat continued with Fr. Joel presenting four talks on growing our relationship with Christ, pursuing Him through the gift of prayer. Father helped us strengthen our ways of talking and listening to God by teaching us several prayer forms: Lectio Divina, Imaginative Prayer, Relational Prayer, and Weekly Review.

The retreat ended with a renewal of our Baptismal Vows, a Commitment Prayer, and a Final Blessing from Fr. Joel. For those interested, a tour of the

interior of the Cathedral was offered. Twenty participants took the tour led by a Ministry Docent.

The evaluations were overwhelmingly positive. Helping to make the retreat a success were the 48 parishioners who willingly volunteered their talents in fulfilling many of the tasks associated with the retreat. A very special thank you to them!

Also, the Stewardship Advisors gratefully thank Fr. Joel for inspiring us to deepen our relationship with God through prayer. We thank Fr. Michael for his vision of building a stewardship culture at the Cathedral. And a thank you to everyone who participated in the retreat by attending, helping, and praying together as one Body of Christ, striving to live a stewardship way of life as disciples of Jesus.

A Glimpse of Spirituality 靈修一瞥120 (Matt 7:21, 24-27) Fr. Abraham Chiu 趙必成神父

Who can be saved? Jesus said, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven."

The verb "does" (poiōn) literally denotes constructing, doing, or making. Here it carries the meaning of the kind of action that doing Father's will requires from all Christians the practice of the beatitudes (Matt 5:2-11). Moreover, the Father also invites us all to let God's light in us shine forth so that people may see our good works and give glory to the Father (Matt 5:16) and to act in generous and loving ways - even toward our enemies (Matt 5:38-48). That is to say, sincerity in Christians can be demonstrated not by what they say but by what they practice. That is what Jesus insisted on doing the will of the Father.

Fine words can never be a substitute for fine deeds. Faith without practice is a contradiction in terms, and love without loyalty is impossibility. We may deceive people with our words, but we cannot deceive God who reads our hearts. Jesus contrasted a wise man who practiced what he believed and a fool who did not practice his religious beliefs. Only a firm house foundation can withstand the storm and only a life which foundations are sure can stand the test. The two builders sum up two ways - the way of perfect righteousness and the way of self-righteousness.

The story also suggests that God does not shelter Christians from life's storms (e.g., accidents, illness, death). Our strong faith and prayers, however, can lead us to peace of heart and mind. Christians, like everyone else, must be prepared to live through the storms and tragedies that are common to humankind, nevertheless, they suffer with the resurrected Christ, though once being crucified.

誰能得救？

耶穌說：“不是凡向我說‘主啊！主啊！’的人，就能進入天國；而是那承行我在天之父旨意的人，才能進天國。”

動詞“承行” (poiōn) 字面意思是建構、去做或製作。更精確定義就是承行天父旨意，這需要基督徒實踐真福八福 (瑪5:2-11)；此外，天父也要求所有信徒讓天主光榮在生命彰顯出來，使世界看見基督徒的善行，歸光榮於天父 (瑪5:16)，並以慷慨和愛德行事，包括仇人 (瑪5:38-48) 這就是說，基督徒的真誠不是靠嘴巴說說，而是行動來體現，這就是耶穌堅持的，要承行天父旨意。

花言巧語永遠不能取代英豪善行，沒有實踐的信仰本身自相矛盾，沒有忠誠的愛不可存立。言語可以騙人，但無法欺騙看透人心的天主。耶穌將實踐信仰的智者與罔顧信仰的愚人對比，只有地基堅固的房子才能經得起風雨，只有根基穩固的人生才能經得起考驗。兩位建造者總結了兩條人生路，就是完全正義的道路和自以為是的道路。

這故事也表明，天主不會刻意偏心基督徒免於生活風暴 (如意外、疾病、死亡)。然而，堅定信德和熱切祈禱可讓人心平靜。基督徒和其他人一樣，必須準備好經歷世界常見的風風雨雨，不一樣的，是與復活基督一起受苦，儘管耶穌曾被釘在十字架上。

READING 1 **ACTS 3:13-15, 17-19**

Peter said to the people:

"The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and denied in Pilate's presence when he had decided to release him. You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses. Now I know, brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did; but God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. 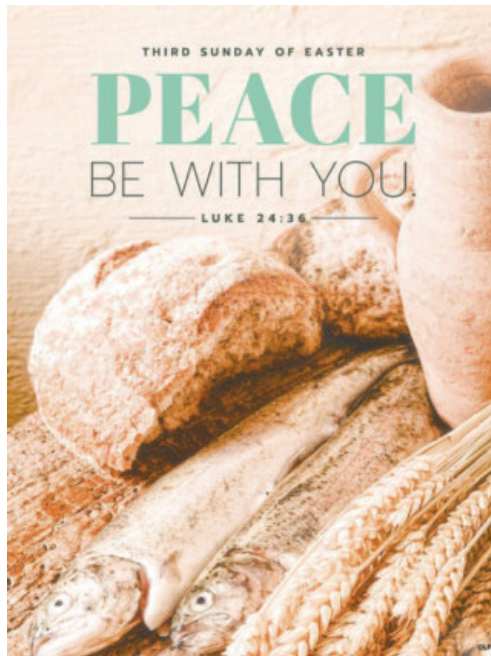

Family Faith Formation and OCIA

As we consider the “Spiritual Battle” we must engage in, this week we consider the “stumbling stones” to our spiritual life: Distraction.

LOOK! SQUIRREL! Distraction in the Spiritual Life

Over the last couple of weeks leading up to Easter Sunday, we have had a lot to inspire us in the spiritual life. But then, have you noticed how those good intentions quickly fade, and we forget what we set out to accomplish? Many times our failed good intentions to grow in our prayer life are due to one of the most common and difficult obstacles to prayer: DISTRACTION. Distraction is easily one of the most difficult and common obstacles to prayer. This is also a particular challenge in our present day and age. In the less electronically dominated past, there were natural moments of quiet, and places where someone could retire for stillness. Now the sounds and flashes of technology drown out

environments helpful to introspection. God does understand that prayer is a battle for us. He knows that we are easily influenced by our senses: those things that we can touch, hear, and see. When we are distracted, the most effective way of dealing with our distractions is to offer them up to God, humbly accepting that we cannot pray on our own. However, we should also be forming habits to counteract our distractions. We should ask ourselves: Do we try to still our mind before beginning to pray? Do we enter a quiet room and put away our phones? Are our bodies slouched while praying, or are we kneeling or sitting straight? These physical and external realities influence our prayer lives, as well as cultivate an attitude of reverence when we pray.

Terms to Know in Spiritual Battle:

Dryness: The feeling that no one is listening when we pray.

Persevere: To continue in spite of facing obstacles.

Spiritual Combat: Our fight against the temptations of the devil.

Focus of the Gospel:

The readings for next Sunday—Good Shepherd Sunday—demonstrate that Jesus Christ cares for us as a shepherd cares for his flock. Jesus explains that he is the good shepherd who knows his sheep and will do anything to save them. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter (the first Pope) makes it clear that salvation is exclusively found in Jesus Christ, “...the cornerstone of our faith.” Together, the readings help us to reflect on how we are the Flock of Jesus the Shepherd. We must learn to listen to His voice in Sacred Scripture, in the teachings of the Church, and learn to make choices that reflect our love for Christ, especially when we feel we need to ‘give up’ something in order to better reflect Jesus and His love to others.

¡MIRAR! ¡ARDILLA! Distracción en la vida espiritual

Durante las últimas semanas previas al Domingo de Pascua, hemos tenido mucho que inspirarnos en la vida espiritual. Pero entonces, ¿has notado cómo esas buenas intenciones se desvanecen rápidamente y olvidamos lo que nos propusimos lograr? Muchas veces nuestras buenas intenciones fallidas de crecer en nuestra vida de oración se deben a uno de los obstáculos más comunes y difíciles de la oración: LA DISTRACCIÓN. La distracción es fácilmente uno de los obstáculos más difíciles y comunes para la oración. Este es también un desafío particular en nuestra época actual. En el pasado menos dominado por la electrónica, había momentos naturales de tranquilidad y lugares donde alguien podía retirarse para descansar. Dios sí entiende que la oración es una batalla para nosotros. Él sabe

que nuestros sentidos: aquellas cosas que podemos tocar, oír y ver, nos influyen fácilmente. Cuando estamos distraídos, la forma más efectiva de lidiar con nuestras distracciones es ofrecérselas a Dios, aceptando humildemente que no podemos orar solos. Sin embargo, también deberíamos formar hábitos para contrarrestar nuestras distracciones. Deberíamos preguntarnos: ¿Tratamos de aquietar nuestra mente antes de comenzar a orar? ¿Entramos en una habitación tranquila y guardamos nuestros teléfonos? ¿Nuestros cuerpos están encorvados mientras oramos, o estamos arrodillados o sentados erguidos? Estas realidades físicas y externas influyen en nuestra vida de oración, además de cultivar una actitud de reverencia cuando oramos.

Las lecturas del próximo domingo, el Domingo del Buen Pastor, demuestran que Jesucristo cuida de nosotros como un pastor cuida de su rebaño. Jesús explica que él es el buen pastor que conoce a sus ovejas y hará cualquier cosa para salvarlas. En los Hechos de los Apóstoles, Pedro (el primer Papa) deja claro que la salvación se encuentra exclusivamente en Jesucristo, "...la piedra angular de nuestra fe". Juntas, las lecturas nos ayudan a reflexionar sobre cómo somos el Rebaño de Jesús Pastor. Debemos aprender a escuchar Su voz en la Sagrada Escritura, en las enseñanzas de la Iglesia, y aprender a tomar decisiones que reflejen nuestro amor por Cristo, especialmente cuando sentimos que necesitamos "renunciar" a algo para reflejar mejor a Jesús y Su amor a los demás.

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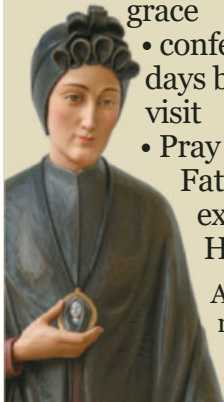

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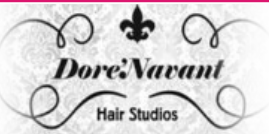
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
